CLARENDON TOWN BOARD—Meeting Highlights July 2016

Clarendon's Troop 59 Boy Scout Ben Downey addressed the Board, presenting his proposal for a community project towards his Eagle Scout rank. Ben would like to put a fence along the tree line behind the new memorial and flag at the Hillside Cemetery that will span approximately 200 feet starting 5-10 feet from the Route 237 sidewalk and end by the flower mound. Ben gave the board an estimated cost for the project needing \pm \$2000 for the fencing. Ben plans to do a lot of fund raising. Board members were very happy with the proposal.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Swanger reported that the second roadside mowing has been started. Shoulders are completed on the newly paved portion of Powerline Road. The Clarendon crew has been helping other towns. Meter readings are done and water bills will be mailed. It was reported that a hydrant was found opened on the Howard Road. That water supply for Howard Road is through the Village of Holley. Superintendent Swanger received a call from Assistant Fire Chief Bob Freida who closed the hydrant; the field was flooded. Hamlin and Morton experienced the same problem the same night. The Sheriff knows about it. Some towns have locks on their water hydrants. Superintendent Swanger reported a problem on South Manning Road. There was a 1" hole in a resident's copper service waterline on the shoulder of the road. The Monroe County Water Authority bill to the town was over three million gallons more than usual.

There were no signs of the water leak; the water went right into the rock. Superintendent showed a picture of the pipe with the hole in it. It was replaced with PVC pipe. The Highway crew has been unsuccessful in finding a leak somewhere in the Hamlet. Experts in finding water leaks will be contacted to assist.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Dave Griggs reported no meetings were held last month.

CORRESPONDENCE

The Orleans County Treasurer has sent the second quarter sales tax revenue check in the amount of \$77,892.13. Notice has been received from First Niagara/Key Bank that the Holley Branch is closing October 7, 2016. Supervisor informed that a meeting has been scheduled with the entities that utilize that bank to try and have it stay open or bring in another bank.

OLD BUSINESS

The Board scheduled a water workshop to be held August 15, 2016 at 6:00 PM at the Town Hall

In reference to the SAM Grant application for funding to paint the water tower, the Board adopted a SEQR Resolution and a resolution committing to the in-kind funding for the project beyond grant funds.



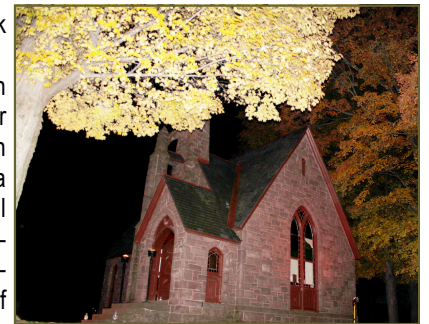
ORLEANS COUNTY HERITAGE FESTIVAL

Plans for a county-wide celebration of Orleans County history and heritage are progressing for the first annual Orleans County Heritage Festival September 9 through 11, 2016. Over the course of the weekend, participants can grab a free "heritage passport" at any participating organization and visit a minimum of six historic sites. The passport can then be redeemed for an attractive collectable pin with

their names entered in a drawing for some great prizes. Meant to shine a spotlight on the fantastic historic assets of Orleans County, visitors to the heritage festival will have many choices available to them. Encompassing four main themes: Agriculture, Transportation, Historic Cemeteries and Historic gems, visitors might visit a family farm, walk along the Eric Canal, go on a ghost walk or visit the historic district of Medina or Albion.

The Clarendon Historical Society will be participating by hosting a Ghost Walk in Hillside Cemetery with local historical figures as portrayed by local residents and folks from GCC, on September 10th. Tour groups of 10 will begin every 10 minutes, starting at 7:00 PM and 8:00 PM. Tickets are \$10 per person and available the day of the event. This is a fund raising event for the restoration of the 1894 Medina Sandstone chapel in the cemetery. *Bring a friend!*

In addition, Genesee Community College will participate in the Heritage festival with its own contributions located at GCC's two Orleans County campuses. The Medina Campus Center invites visitors to "Epochs in Orleans" – a timeline festival on Saturday, September 10 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., featuring re-enactors and impressionists from all eras of history. There will be artisan demonstrations, antique autos, Civil War firing demonstrations and much more.



Meanwhile, GCC's Albion Campus Center will focus on "Death, Mourning and Justice in Orleans County History" also on Saturday, September 10 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., featuring a recreated Victorian wake in the family parlor. Two public lectures will accompany the exhibit. The first of these will focus on famous crimes and murders with Orleans County District Attorney Joseph Cardone at 10 a.m. Retired Orleans County historian Bill Lattin will give a talk on Victorian hair jewelry at 12 p.m. *Many more events are planned. Mark your calendar and keep an eye out for more information!*

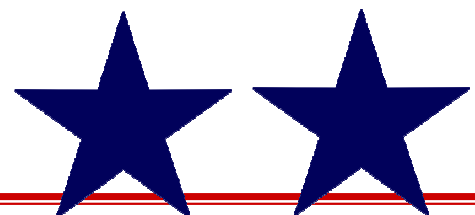

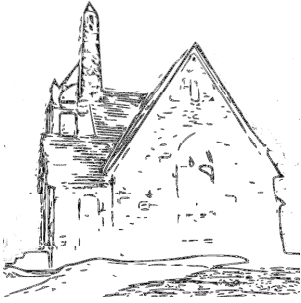

Hillside Sketches

Recently Dr. Henry Bliss was featured in Hillside Sketches, but one doesn't have to look too far to realize his father, **Edwin Bliss (1819-1901)**, is worthy of a similar recognition.

Edwin Bliss was born on July 13, 1819 in Kendall, NY. At first a farmer, he later became a well-recognized carpenter. Upon moving to Holley in 1867, Bliss became associated with Luther Gordon who had a successful lumber and building business. For many years he was the principal builder in the village. In 1878 he built the brick business block on Thomas Street across from the Downs Hotel. In 1890, he was hired to do the carpentry work on the new Baptist Church on Geddes Street. The cost of his work, when reported by the Baptist Church at its dedication, was \$4,660.67.



He served as trustee of the village and was elected Supervisor of the Town of Murray. Bliss was one of the organizers of the Holley Electric Light Co., and served as its president in 1844. The village lost two worthy gentlemen in the year 1901; Edwin Bliss and John Downs.

Roy Bubb's latest book, *The Family Scrapbook; An Era in Holley's History* will cover more detail. Anticipated publishing date is Spring 2017.

Learn About Clarendon's Quarries

Plan to attend the August meeting of the Clarendon Historical Society. The featured speaker will be Jennifer Wells-Dickerson who will speak about Pasquale DiLaura's quarry in Clarendon. Come and learn about one of the last operating quarries that existed in Clarendon and Pasquale DiLaura, the man responsible for its extended life, from his great granddaughter. Jennifer Wells-Dickerson works as a professional jeweler. She lives in Hamlin, NY. As a high school student she first researched the local quarry industry as a class project. Her great-grandfather kept very detailed records of his business and evidence of the work accomplished by him is evident today. If you have ever been on the parkway or to Hamlin Beach State Park you will surely notice the Medina sandstone that was used in many ways from bridges, to walk ways and buildings. She has a great collection of photographs from DiLaura's business.

The presentation will be held on Wednesday, August 17, 2016 at 7:00 PM at the Clarendon Historical Society which is located 16426 Fourth Section Road, at the intersection of Route 31A and Church Street in Clarendon. It is free and open to the public. Light refreshments will be served.
