ATTENTION HOMEOWNERS WITH BASIC STAR (UNDER 65 YEARS OLD)

The Deadline to Register with NYS Tax Department is December 31, 2013. If you have not already done so you must register with the tax department to continue receiving the Star Exemption.

This DOES NOT APPLY to Seniors 65 and older who receive the Enhanced/Senior Star Exemption. Seniors will continue to reapply with the Assessor by March 1, 2014 as usual and renewal applications will be mailed at the end of December as always.

If you are a Basic Star recipient and have not received either of the 2 mailings sent by NYS Tax Department, the number to call is (518) 457-2036 or if you have the mailing with the Star Code, you can apply online at www.tax.ny.gov

NYS Tax Department will send notification to the Assessors requiring that the exemption be removed so don't wait, Register NOW.

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

November 2013

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT –

Larry P. Swanger, Superintendent

Superintendent Swanger reported that necessary equipment is ready for winter; that the crew was out once last week. Other equipment is being worked on. Superintendent reported helping the Village of Holley with their water break on Election Day. Six feet of wire and the plug (for lights) had been cut off the small trailer kept behind the highway garage. Hydrants are still be flushed.

Trees have fallen in the Hillside Cemetery due to the high winds; the highway crew is removing them. Superintendent Swanger informed that the excavator was used to make a driveway at Hillside on the old side; one level wasn't accessible. One grave was dug this past month.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

– David R. Griggs, Chairman

Chairman Griggs submitted a written report as follows:

10-22-2013 (Regular Meeting)

- The Planning Board held a pre-conference for a site plan review, SD 13-07 Heather Colella 16530 Fourth Section Road- Application for a Site Plan Review for a Land Reclamation, Fill, Permit tax id # 98.-1-41.1. Applicant was not present. The Planning Board had a number of unanswered questions and tabled this review until the applicant could be present.

- The Planning Board held a pre-conference for a site plan review SD 13-08, Tim Towne, 4980 Holley Byron Road for the construction of a 24' x 24' pole barn. No issues were noted with the proposal, applicant informed they could wave pre-conference; a motion was made, seconded and approved to amend the agenda from a pre-conference to a formal. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve site plan review.
- Special Use Permit Renewal. Fee paid, Inspected, No complaints on file. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve renewal of Special Use Permit SP 10-02, Micah Eldrich 4641 Hall Road, Alternative Energy System (wind) tamer 3.5 KW).
- Special Use Permit Renewal. Fee paid, Inspected, No complaints on file. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve renewal of Special Use Permit SP 06-001, Tim McCollough 5375 Upper Holley Road, Best Rentals.
- Special Use Permit Renewal. Fee paid, Inspected, No complaints on file. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve renewal of Special Use Permit SP 12-02 Adam Johnson, 15549 East Lee Road, Blue Top Management storage/recycle collection.

11-12-2013 (regular Meeting)

- Special Use Permit Renewal. Fee paid, Inspected, No complaints on file. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve renewal of Special Use Permit SP 10-03, Gary Westfall 4533 Hulberton Road- Bull's Eye Deer Processing.
- The Planning Board continued a pre-conference for a site plan review, SD 13-07 Heather Colella 16530 Fourth Section Road- Application for a Site Plan Review for a Land Reclamation, Fill, Permit tax id # 98.-1-41.1. After review and by unanimous consent the Planning Board determined that this project, as presented by the applicant, falls under the exception clause of Article III, Section 306 B. and that at this point in time there is no need for a Land Reclamation, fill, permit. The applicant was made aware that OIO will continue to monitor this project and if there is any scope changes additional review may be necessary.

CLARENDON HISTORICAL SOCIETY REPORT –

Jim Moore, President

President Moore acknowledged the Christmas figures being raffled by the Society. Roy Bubb was thanked for the donation of the figures; President Moore estimated \$500 profit from raffle ticket sales. Winning tickets will be picked at tomorrow's regular

meeting. The museum buildings have been winterized; the CHS will meet at the Town Hall through the winter.

SUPERVISOR REPORT-

Richard H. Moy, Supervisor

Supervisor Moy informed that Assemblyman Steve Hawley will be available to the residents at the Clarendon Town Hall next Saturday, Nov. 28th, from 10:30 AM – 11:15 AM.

Supervisor Moy introduced Marc Major to those present; he is the newly elected Councilman who will replace E. John DeFilippis on the Town Board. Mr. DeFilippis has been elected to a seat on the Orleans County Legislature.

CORRESPONDENCE

Correspondence has been received from Assemblywoman and member of the committee on Real Property Taxation Aileen Gunter, in response to Clarendon's adopted Resolution RM2013-217 in support of exempting Orleans County from a law relating to the assessed value of residential real property used for rental purposes.

The Town has received a copy of Orleans County Resolution No. 350-1013, calling on the State to apply uniform and consistent procedures that counties must abide by to appropriately calculate their property tax cap.

The Town has received \$1.00 in full payment for the Old Stone Store property at 16301 East Lee Road, Clarendon.

Orleans County has submitted its State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) on the Self-Support Radio Tower to be placed by the Highway Garage in Clarendon.

The Orleans County Legislature has sent the Mortgage Tax distribution from April through September, 2013; Clarendon will receive \$7000 more than was budgeted for in the amount of \$18,392.86.

OLD BUSINESS

Supervisor Moy reviewed that the Special Election for the Water Improvement Benefit Area No. 11 project will be held December 5, 2013. Letters have

been mailed to eligible voters in the project area boundary. Town Clerk will send letters to the inspectors that will work the election next week.

Attorney Schubel informed Supervisor Moy that there is no new progress in the Brown Schoolhouse Road town property research; Parcel 108.-1-12.23.

Supervisor Moy stated that the property at 16730 Glidden Road has since last month's meeting, been purchased and the unsafe structure will be removed; there is no need for a public hearing.

NEW BUSINESS

The Town Board adopted Resolutions authorizing Beverly Pape at 1194 LaDue Road in the Town of Sweden, Out-of-District User Status in Clarendon Water District No. 7 and authorizing Supervisor Moy to sign the subscriber agreement with New York Municipal Insurance Reciprocal (NYMIR) for Town insurance coverage.
