CLARENDON TOWN BOARD—Meeting Highlights October 2015

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Larry Swanger, Superintendent

Superintendent Swanger reported the third roadside mowing complete. Clarendon has been helping the county and other towns with paving projects. All materials for the roof project are at the highway garage; crew is working on the roof. Two graves have been dug this past month. Work with the mini excavator is being done to clear out the cemetery.

The new truck is done; needs a final inspection. It should be in next week. The Sterling was sold at auction; it brought \$19,000; Town received \$17,100. Auctioneer gets 10%.

Twenty-three people have hooked into to WIBA #11 waterline already. The contractor is working on a punch list, but is mostly done.

The Planning Board did not meet. No reports were submitted for the Planning Board, Historian/Historical Society or the Supervisor.

CORRESPONDENCE

Orleans County Personnel and Self Insurance has send a revised copy of the approved self-insurance plan for 2016; the Town's premium is \$33,736.00 and the Fire Company is \$644.00; totaling \$34,380.00. This is a 1.4% decrease.

The Orleans County Self-Insurance quarterly meeting will be held October 26, 2015 at 11:00 AM. Supervisor will attend.

Orleans County Board of Elections has sent detailed information concerning the general election on November 3, 2015.

The NYS Department of Public Service has scheduled public meetings to seek consumer input regarding Reforming the Energy Vision (REV).

Supervisor Moy read aloud a letter of resignation received from the Zoning Board of Appeals from Chairman Arthur Kaminski. Supervisor has sent Mr. Kaminski a letter of appreciation for his 29 years of service to the community.

A State Aid check in the amount of \$11,416.00 has been received. Two partial restitution payments have been received for the Court Loss \$114.29 and \$95.24.

A 2016 Orleans Heritage Festival is being planned; One day will be planned to visit different sites in the County.

Orleans County has approved Clarendon's application for demolition assistance on 16323 Church Street barn.

Community Action has again requested funding be budgeted for the Community Center in 2016; Supervisor acknowledged that the Board has included this in the proposed budget.

The Community Free Library in Holley is conducting a survey via print and electronic sources to find out how to best communicate with individuals and families about library programs and services in their circulation area.

"We plan many programs for children and adults. Some are well attended. Some are not. We want to use our tax dollars effectively by having programming people want to and will attend," according to Barb Kerns, President of the Board of Trustees for the Library. "We also have many FREE services available to our community members we'd like to make sure they know about. To do this, we need to know the best ways to reach people. Therefore, we

have prepared this survey to see how people obtain information." To encourage people to return the survey to the library, names of all people completing the survey will be entered in a drawing for a \$50 gift card for Walmart. The survey will be conducted during the month of November, with a December 5, 2015 deadline for returning the surveys to the library. *The Clarendon Gazette has the print version on page 5 of this issue.* Those preferring to submit the electronic version may go to <http://goo.gl/forms/VNLF40Q7NP> on the web.

OLD BUSINESS

Water Improvement Benefit Area No. 11; the contractor is mostly done with the project. Supervisor informed that money is held back until final inspection by engineer is done, confirming sufficient property restorations, etc...

Water District No. 9 Extension; Chatfield Engineers has informed that it will be mid-December before the Town can get the needed agency permits for the project.

Monroe County Water Authority: Supervisor Moy, Superintendent Swanger and Councilman Robinson met with the Monroe County Water Authority to review the proposed contract. MCWA will send a list of items discussed at the meeting. MCWA will maintain any new plastic pipes installed, but will not replace them. The Town of Byron currently charges \$25 in addition to the debt service charge on the tax bill; to be saved for future waterline replacement when needed. Superintendent Swanger will get a cost estimate to paint the water tower. If the Town goes with MCWA, they would cover painting the tower.

Supervisor Moy stated that if the Town keeps the water, it needs to be run like a business; Currently the amount paid vs amount charged is bringing no revenue to the water districts.

The Town Board accepted the sealed bid for metal roofing materials to be used to re-roof the Highway Garage as submitted by Stockham Lumber Co., 88 Geddes Street, Holley, NY 14470 totaling \$18,229.97.

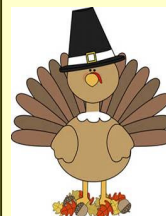

*Hillside
Sketches*

Recently we celebrated the generous donation by Brigden Memorials of a beautiful gravestone for Lillian Bentham Black, the Titanic survivor buried in Hillside Cemetery. Now let's turn our attention to another grave near hers. Lillian wanted to be buried in Hillside to be near her dear sister, **Daisy Gertrude Bentham**. She and Lillian were daughters of **Henry Bentham**, a stone cutter in the quarries, and **Mary Jane Smith Bentham**. Daisy was born June 4, 1888 in England and immigrated to America with her family as a small child in 1891. Lillian was born the next year.



Daisy was a beloved child who excelled at Spelling in school. She suffered a long illness before her death which she bore "with gentle resignation". But she died at home in East Holley on March 2, 1904 before reaching the age of 16. Her obituary describes her as an "exceptionally beautiful and charming child." This must be true, as her sister wished to be buried near her 73 years later. We usually speak of the Victorian symbols on the older gravestones, and indeed, the sides of Daisy's stone are gracefully edged with acanthus leaves which represent eternal life. But Daisy's stone has a more obvious and heart-rending symbol – that of a daisy with a broken stem – symbolizing her beautiful life, cut short, too soon. In death, she is united with her parents, sister and brother in Hillside Cemetery.
