CLARENDON PUBLIC WATER CUSTOMERS be aware that delinquent water bills, together with penalty, shall become a lien against the real property upon which or in connection with which the water is used. Such a lien is prior and superior to any other lien or claim except the lien of an existing tax. **The Town Board shall include delinquent water charges, penalties and an additional \$100 penalty in the annual tax levy and shall levy the same upon the real property in default in accordance with the Town Law.** The Town Board shall determine by Resolution, which of the unpaid water bills will be reassessed and added to the January property tax bill at the special meeting scheduled for **November 8, 2017** at 6:00 PM at the Town Hall.

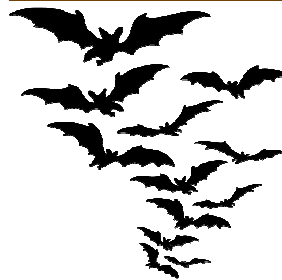

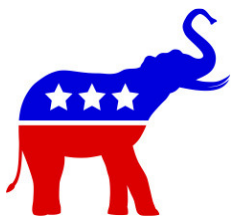

Nick Penna, owner of Penna Farms spoke with board members about his farming operation on the Hillside Cemetery land above the Holy Cross Cemetery and the heavy rains of this summer. Mr. Penna has oats planted at the top now. It was agreed that Mr. Penna will leave the top part of that land in grass

and not farm it to help with keeping the water from rushing down into the cemetery.

Dan Botsford presented the Board with information about the new paid family leave act that will be in effective 1/1/2018. This is an employee funded program through paycheck deductions that allows an extended partial paid leave for specific reasons. Private employers are mandated to have this; municipalities have the option. Clarendon Board decided not to be part of the Family Paid Leave Act.

OPEN END

Tracy Chalker spoke to the board regarding a water meter issue at his home. The Chalkers have renovated their landscaping and require a wire from their water meter in the basement and installation of a meter reader outside. Superintendent Swanger was absent from the meeting; board members in agreement that Mr. Swanger install the new reader.

HIGHWAY /WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Swanger, being out of town at the annual highway conference, submitted a written report: All 416 fire hydrants in the town have been flushed. A culvert pipe was changed on Howard Road and two 36" culvert pipes on County Line Road. Four graves have been dug and the yearly lead & copper water testing is complete. Clarendon helped the NYS DOT haul grinding from Route 31A in front of Thomas Estates along with assistance from Murray and Kendall. The third roadside mowing has been started. The Board declared the 2006 550 Ford Dump Truck with plow and 1997 1 ¾ yard hopper sander surplus equipment and authorized it be sold at auction October 7, 2017.

HISTORIAN/HISTORICAL SOCIETY REPORT

Attended and spoke at the Akeley Fox dedication September 16th at the Cobblestone Museum; Working again this year with Albion Middle School Service Learning Class teacher Tim Archer. His students are re-painting 3 historic markers that are related to the canal. This is the 200th anniversary of the canal, many activities are being planned; another Eagle Scout candidate is preparing for his project.

He is concentrating on dressing up the veteran's section of Hillside Cemetery;

CHS speaker this Wednesday is Michael Keene, on the Holley Boys who were killed in Viet Nam. Program starts at 7pm; this year has been busy with people visiting to do research and family history. Some have shared information and pictures which will be added to the collections we have. Ohio, California, New Hampshire, Vermont, New York City and even Thailand!; Assisting the Holley Class of 1966 and 1967 with their 50 year class reunion by putting together a slide show for their event; Gathering info on WWI and WWII for history teachers who are concentrating on these wars and their connection to our area.

CORRESPONDENCE

Orleans County Highway sent notice of 2017-2018 sanding & plowing percentage increase. NYMIR has sent a schedule of its public works fall/winter seminars. Bennett, DiFilippo & Kurtzhaltz, LLP has sent notice of increase in rates for real property tax litigation services. Orleans County Self Insurance has sent its apportionment of assessments for 2018; Clarendon's will be for town \$29,878 and for Fire Co. \$265 totaling \$30,143. NYS Real Property has sent notice confirming the Final State Equalization Rate for Clarendon is 100%. We have received \$105,903.84 from New York State DOT in CHIPS aid.

OLD BUSINESS

The Town Board authorized expenditure for LaBella Associates to prepare Rural Development Applications and prepare environmental review for proposed Water Improvement Benefit Areas 12 and 13. The Board authorized spending \$6500 for Chatfield to prepare map, plan and report for WIBA 12 and 13. The Hillside Chapel Roof Restoration project should be done in November. The Town Board accepted National Grid's proposal for total LED Conversion at a cost of \$2944.86 for the 37 roadway streetlights with the converted lights still being owned, operated and maintained by National Grid. The Board accepted the Tentative Budget at a town tax rate of \$4.5331; this becomes the preliminary budget. *(See notice on front page for public hearing.)*

NEW BUSINESS

The Board voted in favor of the proposed county local law for dog control. The Board authorized \$1383.88 for a website upgrade by C&H PC, Inc., Medina. The Board will consider retrofit to town hall inside lighting to LED next year. A water workshop has been scheduled for November 14, 2017 at 6:30 PM at Town Hall.

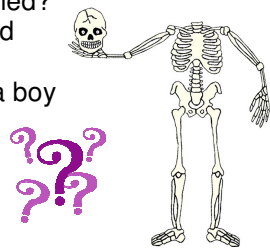

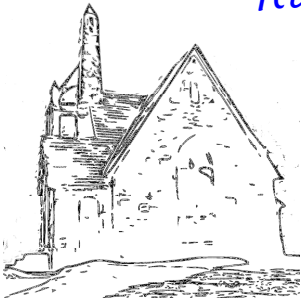

Hillside Sketches



Staff Sgt. Ross C. Turner is buried in Hillside Cemetery on the old side at the very bottom terrace. I happened to be there one evening doing some work and saw this display located above his head stone.



A photograph of Ross in his uniform is displayed along with two telegrams. The first telegram informs his family that he has been taken prisoner by the Japanese government and is being held in the Philippines. The second telegram informs the family that he died.

A type written note by the family explains that Ross Turner was taken captive 9 April 1942 after the fall of Bataan. He endured the infamous and brutal Bataan Death march. He succumbed to dysentery, starvation and malaria. He was buried in a mass grave and his remains were never recovered. The note ended with: LET US NEVER FORGET!

I was so touched by this loving tribute. This has been placed only recently so I encourage anyone who walks in the cemetery to take the path to the bottom terrace and admire this lovely tribute to a lost son.

How Old is that Deer?

As deer season approaches, hunters are scouting the deer they will be hunting this fall. Estimating their age is important for making informed harvest decisions.

For antlerless deer, the primary question is whether you are observing a fawn or adult. While yearling (1.5-year-old) bucks are relatively easy to identify, estimating the age of older bucks can be more difficult. To learn how, see DEC's [Guide to Aging White-tailed Deer in New York](#). Allowing yearling bucks to survive an extra year may enhance your deer hunting experience, especially if your hunting partners and neighbors are also passing on yearling bucks. With more older bucks around, hunters tend to observe more scrapes, rubs, sparring, and chasing, and they have a greater chance to bring home deer with more meat and larger antlers.

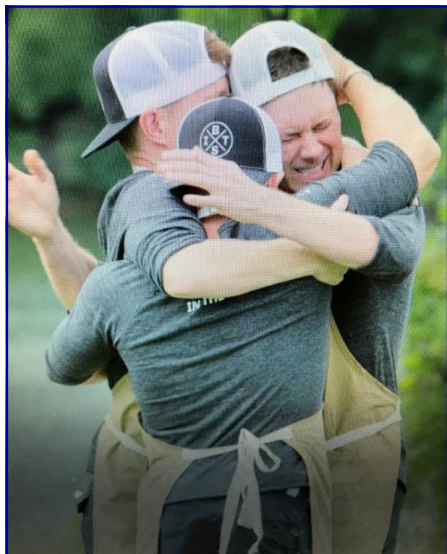

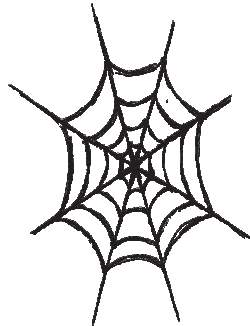
