Proposed increments of payment for services are as follows: 2014 \$165,780.00; 2015 \$167,694.82; 2016 \$169,646.02; 2017 \$171,634.30; 2018 \$173,660.35. The complete agreement is available for review at the Town Clerk's Office upon request. Anyone wishing to speak in favor of or in opposition to the proposed agreement will be heard at this Hearing. **RESIDENTS TAKE FURTHER NOTICE** that the Clarendon Town Board has scheduled a Public Hearing to begin immediately following the Fire Company Agreement Hearing for the purpose of reviewing the proposed 2014 Preliminary Budget for the Town. Anyone wishing to speak in favor of or in opposition to such budget may do so at this hearing. A copy of the proposed Preliminary Budget is available at the Town Clerk's Office upon request, or at the Town's website www.townofclarendon.org on the Supervisor or Town Board page. CLARENDON TOWN BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

September 2013

CLARENDON FIRE COMPANY

Supervisor Moy informed that he and Councilman Robinson met with Mr. Campbell, Mr. Freida and Mr. Biedlingmaier to review the proposed Fire Company budget. Mr. Biedlingmaier explained that the Fire Company's financial advisor felt gradual increases in a five year agreement would be the best for the Fire Company, as opposed to the initial proposed budget amounts. The Fire Company is asking for an \$8000 increase over a five year period; that this proposed budget does not change the total money, only the distribution of it. The Fire Company supplemented last year's budget with \$12,000 from fund raising events. Supervisor Moy complemented the Fire Company on its fantastic job done for the community and asked that a representative come to a Town Board meeting every quarter and give an update. Mr. Biedlingmaier extended an invitation to the Board and community to stop in any Tuesday at the Fire Hall to view equipment and training done by the volunteer fire fighters. He reported the purchase of an off-road rescue vehicle and trailer; possible through Senator Maziarz' help with grant funding and fundraising events. The ladder truck was purchased and will be paid off in five years. This piece of equipment will serve the Fire Company for 25 years. (A copy of the proposed five year agreement is available at the Clerk's Office.)

Chairman Griggs submitted the following written report.

08-27-2013 (Regular Meeting)

- Meeting Cancelled due to insufficient agenda items.

09-10-2013 (Regular Meeting)

- The Planning Board held a pre-conference for a site plan review SD 13-04, Steve Purtell, 16950 4th Section Road (tax id# 99.-1-9.114) for the construction of a 24' x 32' pole barn. No issues were noted with the proposal, applicant informed they could wave pre-conference; a motion was made, seconded and approved to amend the agenda from a pre-conference to a formal.
