

CLARENDON FIRE COMPANY

Supervisor Moy informed that he and Councilman Robinson met with Mr. Campbell, Mr. Freida and Mr. Biedlingmaier to review the proposed Fire Company budget. Mr. Biedlingmaier explained that the Fire Company's financial advisor felt gradual increases in a five year agreement would be the best for the Fire Company, as opposed to the initial proposed budget amounts. The Fire Company is asking for an \$8000 increase over a five year period; that this proposed budget does not change the total money, only the distribution of it. The Fire Company supplemented last year's budget with \$12,000 from fund raising events. Supervisor Moy complemented the Fire Company on its fantastic job done for the community and asked that a representative come to a Town Board meeting every quarter and give an update. Mr. Biedlingmaier extended an invitation to the Board and community to stop in any Tuesday at the Fire Hall to view equipment and training done by the volunteer fire fighters. He reported the purchase of an off-road rescue vehicle and trailer; possible through Senator Maziarz' help with grant funding and fundraising events. The ladder truck was purchased and will be paid off in five years. This piece of equipment will serve the Fire Company for 25 years.

CORRESPONDENCE

A partial restitution payment for the Munger Road Cemetery vandalism has been received. Information has been sent by the NYS Public Service about Lifeline Discount Telephone Service. GoArt (Genesee Orleans Regional Arts Council) is requesting funding. Orleans County Self-Insurance Plan approved 2014 apportionment of assessments has been sent; rates have gone down by \$3000 for town and \$3000 for fire company. Association of Towns 2014 dues will be \$900. A partial restitution payment for the court loss has been received.

OLD BUSINESS

Attorney Schubel reported email correspondence with the Stone Store buyers' attorney regarding the building sale. It looks hopeful to close soon.

A public hearing will be held on Wednesday, September 25^{th} for Water Improvement Benefit Area No. 11. After the public hearing, the Board can form the district and hold a special election for the project. The election needs to be held between 60 – 75 days of district establishment.

The Town Board amended the Water District Rules & Regulations to allow 'over payments' on water accounts; that the *least* amount accepted will be the full amount due.

The Board scheduled a Public Hearing regarding the proposed Fire Co. agreement and the 2014 Preliminary Budget for October 15, 2013. (see notice on front page. A complete copy of the Preliminary Budget is available at the Clerk's

Supervisor informed that the town's insurance policy will expire prior to the next board meeting; that he has been obtaining quotes from different agencies and will meet with an insurance agent on Friday for another proposal. Supervisor requested and was given board authorization to accept the lowest bid after receiving all of them.

After a scheduled public hearing, The Town Board established Water Improvement Benefit Area No. 11 and scheduled a mandatory vote on the project. Fifty one percent of the vote is needed to move forward with the water project. The election was scheduled for Thursday, December 5, 2013 from 12 noon to 8:00 pm at the Town Hall.
