

### HISTORICAL HAPPENINGS IN CLARENDON



We had a very successful program at the CHS this month. "Historic Medina Sandstone of Orleans County", was the program and we were very fortunate to have Bill Lattin, County Historian and members from the Medina Sandstone Society including Bob Waters as well as Erin Anheier speaking about the Quarry Industry in the late 1800's and early 1900's. It was very surprising to most that Clarendon once had eight operating quarries. Our attendance for this event was very good and the evening was a success!



"The Historic Treasure in Our Midst" was sponsored by the town and the CHS on Sunday September 21<sup>st</sup>. This was an event to dedicate and unveil the historic marker that was placed in Hillside as a result of winning a grant from the William Pomeroy Foundation. The chapel was open and we had refreshments and music before the town supervisor read a letter from Steve Hawley and a few words were said. Erin Anheier gave a brief history of the cemetery and also reminded the public that an effort to raise funds to have the chapel restored was in full swing. To date, the CHS has raised over six thousand dollars and several grants have been written to offset the costs should we win them.



Amy Harris retired Holley Music teacher played a selection of songs on her flute inside the chapel and Al Capurso of Albion NY played two songs outside before the unveiling. Al has been a big supporter of Clarendon history and was willing to lend a hand on short notice. He has also donated his services to refurbish the old coal stove inside the chapel (to look at not to use) as it is original to the building and adds character.



Bill Lattin brought historic photos to represent how people mourned in the early 1900's. He also led a fantastic tour of the cemetery grounds and spoke of the symbolism that was utilized on grave stones and what the different symbols represented. Our cemetery has some of the pioneers of both Clarendon and Holley as well as Murray buried in it. We have a Titanic survivor and a stone donated in memory of the two men who were lost in the Titanic disaster. The grounds are peaceful and there are paths to walk that lead to the different terraces.



On October 15<sup>th</sup> the CHS will have a speaker at its monthly meeting. Former Clarendon Resident Roy Bubb will be giving a talk on "Memories of Manning Corners"; he will share stories of his boyhood and talk about the early residents of Manning Corners. The CHS will have Roy's published works for sale including Clarendon to Colon, The Lure of Panama's Isthmus and the book titled Memories of Manning Corners. Roy will be donating a copy of his book Visions from a White Mountain Palette for every copy of Clarendon to Colon sold. ### NOT A GOOD TIME TO START A DIET!

## FITNESS CENTER COMING SOON TO HOLLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT

A new fitness center will soon be opening at Holley Elementary School for use by the students, staff and community. The creation of the fitness center is due to the Carol White Physical Education Program (PEP) multi-year federal grant Holley received earlier this year in the amount of \$441,000. Lisa Campbell, the district's Director of Physical Education, was instrumental in securing this grant for the district. Holley has used the grant money to purchase state of the art fitness equipment to outfit the center.

Initially, the fitness center will be open two nights per week from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m., starting in late fall/early winter. The center will be supervised by a Holley staff member and Holley Security Officers will be on duty during the community use hours. During the evening hours, children under the age of 10 will not be permitted to use the equipment. All participants will be asked to sign a waiver form in order to use the equipment.

Robert D'Angelo, Superintendent of Schools, hopes that the community will stop by the center and see what it has to offer when it opens. "I invite you to use the fitness center as your schedule permits, as it is just one more service that the school district provides the community, and we are very proud to do so," he said.

# CLARENDON TOWN BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

SEPTEMBER 2014

The Town Board held two public hearings and the regular monthly meeting at the Clarendon Firemen's Recreation Hall. Supervisor Moy introduced Monroe County Water Authority (MCWA) representatives, Richard Metzger, Chief Engineer, Nicholas Noce, Executive Director and Steve Savage, Director of Engineering and gave reason for the public hearing. Supervisor informed that Clarendon's oldest water district (WD#2) is twenty years old and that the Board has started looking at a long-range plan for waterline replacement. Materials used for construction of our waterline is said to have a life expectancy of 40-60 years and options are being considered based on that information. Supervisor listed options as 1) do nothing and let future generations worry about it; 2) set aside enough money to replace old water lines. (This is not allowed by New York State); 3) work with Monroe County Water Authority to do the maintenance, repair, replacement, billing and collecting. Supervisor Moy stressed the fact that the Town approached MCWA for information; that MCWA does not solicit for water business. Supervisor pointed out that the Town is in the investigative stages and no decisions have been made regarding MCWA. Supervisor provided handouts showing an estimated savings in debt service charge cost for each district if MCWA takes over the water system. Savings was attributed to town administration, labor and maintenance costs that would be eliminated. MCWA has a \$.19 meter charge per day and charges \$2.92 per 1000 gallons of water used; estimating 180,000 gallons

used per year, cost was estimated at \$525.60 for annual usage cost. Using the same formula, cost per year through the Town is \$579.60. Residences in WIBA #10 living on the Bennetts Corners and Taylor Roads source of supply is through the Village of Holley; how these homes would be handled is still unknown; to be determined.

MCWA representatives presented a slide show of information to those present. Currently the town has a wholesale agreement with MCWA. The Town is responsible for everything in the water districts except for putting water in the pipes. If the town opted for a retail lease agreement, the town would be responsible for new distribution mains on roads without water (at MCWA specifications, currently ductile iron) and any existing debt service. MCWA would handle replacements and system improvements; distribution maintenance and repairs; billing/customer service; new service installations, water quality and testing and public fire hydrants. All retail leases with MCWA are for 40 years.

In regard to existing wells on properties that are hooked into the public water system, MCWA offered the following options: 1) the well would need to be abandoned per New York State Health Department regulations; 2) would need a backflow preventer; or; 3) separate the two sources and have it inspected every five years. MCWA would require an easement and the fee for the inspection is approximately \$50 each.

Resident comment pointed out that MCWA charge for a water tap is double what Clarendon charges.

MCWA representatives stated that less than 5% of the water main repairs are done by contractors, that

usage rates depend on meter size (3/4" is standard) and there are no taxes on the bill. Payment options to MCWA would include by lockbox, mail or credit card. It was stated that the Water Authority is a separate entity public benefit corporation, not part of Monroe County government; that the MCWA governing board is appointed by the Monroe County Legislature, but its charter is from the NYS Legislature. Usage rates are controlled by the amount of maintenance done in the 'entire' customer base. Clarendon public water system would be considered 'average' or 'on par'. MCWA has 3240 miles of pipeline; 180,700 retail customers, 25,000 wholesale customers; it treats 18 Billion gallons/year, has 55 storage facilities and 40 pumping stations.

A resident commented that as the oldest line in town is 20 years old and life expectancy is 40-60 years, with a 40 year agreement the waterline will be at end of life at the end of the contract. It was suggested a shorter agreement be made and if all runs well, then go into the longer agreement. Supervisor reviewed that all contracts with Monroe County Water Authority are for 40 years. Resident concern was expressed that there is no other competition out there for MCWA; that it may become a monopoly.

MCWA estimated the average of miles of waterline per year that is replaced is five to ten miles. In determining which lines need replacing, MCWA uses a checklist; items include but are not limited to: water quality, frequency of main breaks, severity of main breaks, number of customers affected and fire capacity.

Possibility of allowing placement of a tower on top of the

water tower was questioned. MCWA confirmed that if that were to happen, revenue from that would go to MCWA. If it were a ground lease, the town would retain the revenue.

No comments were heard in favor or in opposition to proposed Local Law No. 2 of 2014, entitled A Local Law Amending Local Law No. 1 of 2005 Providing for Design Criteria & Construction Specifications for Land Development. The Town Board did adopt said Subdivision Regulations.

### HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT

Larry P. Swanger, Superintendent Swanger reported that the highway crew has paved Hibbard Road and done the shoulder work. The county and other towns have helped Clarendon and Clarendon has helped them with paving projects this past month. Elizabeth Drive has been sealed and Glidden Road, Route 237 and Merrill Road had been prepared for paving. The third roadside mowing is currently being done.

The water tower was inspected two weeks ago and the resulting report with video should be available by next week.

### CORRESPONDENCE

The Town received a partial restitution payment for court loss and Munger Road Cemetery damage. Payment from Orleans County for the third roadside mowing has been received.

Supervisor Moy read aloud a letter of resignation from the Board of Assessment Review reluctantly submitted by Geary Shenck.

Monroe County Water Authority has submitted confirmation that it can supply

water for Water Improvement Benefit Area 11.

Supervisor Moy reported the Orleans County Self-Insurance Plan 2015 budget has been approved. The town's premium has gone down over \$2000; the Fire Company's premium has decreased \$800.

The Rochester Area Community Foundation has sent notice that the Town's Historic Preservation grant application has been denied. This is the smaller of the two grants applied for in regard to restoring the Hillside Cemetery Chapel.

Path Stone Corporation has sent correspondence regarding services they offer in educating people regarding energy audits and improvement grants.

Insurance Services Office (ISO) thanked Supervisor Moy, Fire Chief Bob Frieda and Todd Ferguson for their help in completing their recent Public Protection Classification survey and has sent a summary report of the same. The report is available for review at the Town Clerk's Office.

The Clarendon Historical Society has submitted a letter requesting consideration during the town's budgeting process for the 2015 year.

### OLD BUSINESS

Supervisor Moy will contact Municipal Solutions regarding the financing alternatives for WIBA #11; Supervisor feels the projected amount is too high. Attorney Schubel reported that the Notice of Intent has been sent to farmland protection agency and is hopeful for Comptroller approval of the water project by mid October.

Proposed Zoning Ordinance amendments have been sent to the County Planning Board for review

and there has been no response to date from the NYS Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation regarding the grant application for Hillside Chapel restoration. The Board adopted Local Law No. 2 of 2014, Subdivision Regulation amendments.

The Board will hold a special meeting November 3, 2014 at 9:00 AM at the Town Hall for the purpose of authorizing reassessed mowing and water charges for January tax bills.

Supervisor Moy reported that Attorney David Schubel has decided not to contract with towns next year for legal services but will remain attorney for Orleans County. Proposals have been submitted by Karl Essler, Attorney in Rochester and Andrew Meier, Attorney in Medina. Action on this was tabled until October.

The Board adopted a Resolution authorizing Supervisor Moy to sign the Water Improvement Benefit Area No. 11 application to the NYS Comptroller.
