## PROPOSED WATER IMPROVEMENT BENEFIT AREA NO. 11

Public Hearing will be held on September 17, 2013 at 6:00 PM at the Town Hall, 16385 Church Street, Clarendon. Pursuant to the informational meeting held on June 27, 2013, the Town Board has determined the following areas will be included in proposed WIBA 11: Hinds Road from WD#5 to WD#7; South Holley Road from WD#2 to Sandy Creek; Glidden Road from Holley Byron Road to South Holley Road and 1500 on Merrill Road; Holley Byron Road from Boots Road to New Guinea Road; Howard Road and County Line Road from Howard Road to Taylor Road (Including only units in Clarendon). (*Brown Schoolhouse Road from South Manning Road to Barre Town Line And Upper Holley Road from WD#10 to 4,400 feet south have been Omitted.*) A Revised Cost Analysis will be presented with proposed costs.

**ALSO BE ADVISED** that the regular monthly meeting will commence immediately following the foregoing noticed public hearing.

## FROM THE ASSESSOR’S OFFICE...

STAR Registration Program – The NYS Tax Department has informed that new legislation requires all homeowners receiving a Basic STAR exemption to register with the New York State Tax Department in order to receive STAR exemptions in 2014 and subsequent years. This does not affect 2013 STAR Exemptions. If you have Basic STAR now, you will receive the discount for 2013 on your school tax bill in September.

You will receive a letter with instructions for registration from the NYS Tax Department in the next few weeks. Mailings are scheduled to begin for all of Western New York on August 26, 2013. Once you receive the letter, please follow the instructions for registration. Your local Assessor is *not* authorized to process registrations for Basic STAR. This is part of a new initiative to protect New Yorkers against the costs of inappropriate or fraudulent STAR exemptions.

**Senior Citizens** – The Registration will only apply to Basic STAR recipients. Seniors receiving Enhanced STAR/Senior STAR are not affected by the new registration requirement. Seniors will continue to file each year by March 1<sup>st</sup> with your Assessor and renewal applications will be mailed at the end of the year as usual. This process will not change.

**Basic STAR Recipients** – NYS Tax Department will mail all Basic STAR recipients information on when and how to register. Registration must be done online or by phone with the NYS Tax Department, your Assessor does *not* have authority to process the registration.

**Penalties** – To support the registration effort, the following new penalties, sanctions and fees have been enacted: Penalties for intentionally providing misinformation to an assessor will increase from \$100 to as much as \$2500; The number of years for which a taxpayer must repay inappropriate STAR benefits will increase from three to as many as six years; Taxpayers whose STAR exemption is revoked will be unable to receive the exemption for six years after the revocation; An additional \$500 processing fee will be imposed whenever an inappropriate exemption granted after April 1, 2013 is revoked.

The processing fees and penalties will be retained by local governments, while the State will recover the value of the STAR benefits provided to ineligible taxpayers.

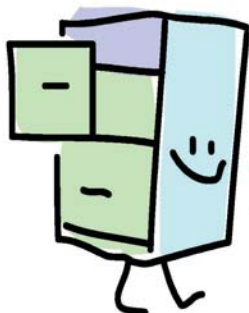

**SPORTSMEN** - If you are a lifetime license holder and have not received your license and tags in the mail you can go to a license issuing agent after Sept. 9th and have them replaced at no charge. **Be Aware that DEC will not replace the license and tags for lifetime license holders for free beyond October 15<sup>th</sup>.** For customers purchasing annual licenses over the phone or online, you will need to allow 10 business days to receive your order. After the 10 business days if you haven't received your order, a replacement license can be issued by a licensing agent at no cost to you. If the customer is a non-resident, the DECALS License Sales Office can handle the replacements after the 10 business days.

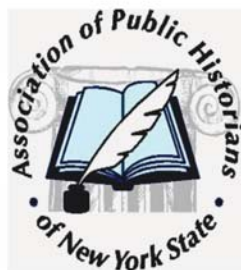

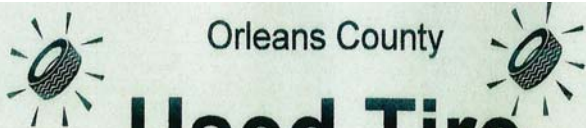

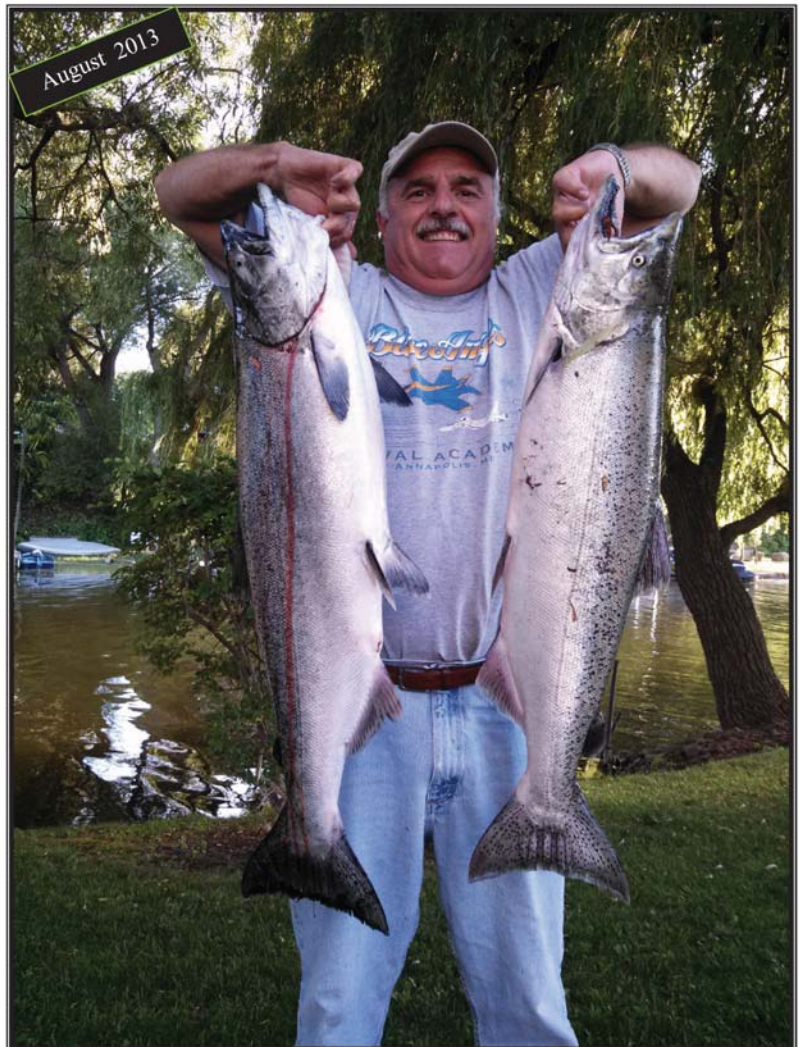

# CLARENDON TOWN BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

August 2013

The Clarendon Town Board held its regular monthly meeting for August 2013 at the Clarendon Historical Society Museum Site, 16426 Fourth Section Road, Clarendon, NY. Supervisor Moy called the meeting to order following the annual 'hot dog roast' festivities.

## HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Larry Swanger reported that the highway crew helped the Town of Murray, Town of Albion and Orleans County with paving and putting on shoulders this month. Also, the highway department paved Upper Holley Road extension, Mill Street and the east end of Hinds Road. New Guinea Road, Boots Road, the south end of Merrill Road and Glidden Road between South Holley and NYS Route 237 were sealed. Today, shoulders were put on all the roads that were paved and a few roads were graded. A new water tap was installed on Brown Schoolhouse Road and two graves dug this past month. Superintendent Swanger hopes to make a decision this week on which the new Highway/Water Department employee will be.

**Assemblyman Steve Hawley** reported attending a meeting today with the top Deputy of Education from the Governor's Office and schools in the Assembly District at Byron Bergen. Assemblyman Hawley has been trying for years to get the Governor to come and meet with school superintendents and board members to let them know that not every school in New York is in a dishevelled state and that we know how to run a school and give quality education even with dwindling funds; to let them know they are tying our hands with the two percent tax cap and mandate relief that does not happen. Assemblyman Hawley will continue to push his 'two New Yorks' bill.

Assemblyman Hawley was thanked for his hard work in keeping the hospital facility in Brockport (Lakeside / Strong Memorial) open.

## CORRESPONDENCE

Orleans County Board of Elections has sent notice of a September 10<sup>th</sup> Republican Primary Election for Town Board Council. *(A sample of the ballot can be found in this issue of the Gazette)*. NYSDOT has sent notice of its annual sign surveillance. Residents with signs on the right-of-way will receive a letter from the State. NYS Division of Historic Preservation has sent confirmation that the Hillside Cemetery is on the National Register. The Town has received a partial restitution payment for the court loss. Holley School has sent notice of its open house/ribbon cutting. *(See notice of event in this issue of the Gazette)*. Holley School Board President Brenda Swanger confirmed that the tax rate shows a four cent increase this year. NYS Real Property Tax Service has sent Notice of 100% Final Equalization Rate for Clarendon and Chatfield Engineers has submitted map, plan and report for proposed Water Improvement Benefit Area #11.

## OLD BUSINESS

It was reported that sale of the Old Stone Store property at 16301 East Lee Road is close to closing. The Heath Department has approved the proposed septic system. Attorney Schubel is waiting to hear from the buyers' attorney and estimates two weeks to closing. Supervisor read aloud a letter submitted by Chairperson of the Old Stone Store Preservation Committee as follows: On behalf of the committee, I wish to thank the Town Board of Clarendon for your vision and foresight in allowing citizens to find a solution to the abandoned Stone Store. As it transfers to new owners this week, we can look forward to it once again being

an attractive part of our hamlet and feel confident it will be preserved for the future. We can also take pride in having it listed on the State and National Registers of Historic Places. The property will now return to the tax rolls and cost of demolition and future site maintenance has been avoided. All of this has been accomplished with volunteer work and donations. There has been no expense to the town. The Fertittas have a great deal of work and expense ahead of them as they restore the building. They have proven their ability to succeed with their transformation of the condemned house on Bennetts Corners Road as well as many properties in Parma. We should be happy that they are willing to invest in our community. To show our appreciation, I request that you waive the fees for any Planning, Zoning or Building permits which will be required as they bring the Old Stone Store back to its historic appearance. Thank you for your consideration. Erin Anheier.

The Town Board scheduled a Public Hearing regarding formation of proposed Water Improvement Benefit Area No. 11 *(see Notice on front page of this Gazette)*.

The Board accepted the Ground Lease Agreement between the Town of Clarendon and Orleans County regarding the County Communications System Tower with the stipulation that the agreement be amended to reflect the following:

The County will lease a portion of the vacant land, located on East Lee Road, Parcel ID #97.-1-42.12 for placement of the communications tower and the Town will give an easement for utilities to the tower coming in from East Lee Road and a Right-Of-Way for traffic access to the tower on the Highway Garage Parcel at 4424 Hindsburg Road, Parcel ID #97.-1-42.2. The Board amended the Water District Rules and Regulations Section

35: Out of District Users to include that the out of district user will pay the current fee to file notice of the agreement with the town in the Orleans County Clerk's Office. The Board scheduled an E-Waste Recycling Day with Blue Top

Management. (See Notice in this Gazette).

The Town Board authorized Supervisor Moy to send a letter in support of Monroe Ambulance in their effort to obtain its Certificate of Transportation, which is needed

to transport anyone from Orleans County to anywhere. Supervisor met with Clarendon Fire Company and they are okay with it. All towns in Orleans County are being asked for such a letter.
