CLARENDON RESIDENTS TAKE NOTICE that the Clarendon Town Board will hold a public hearing on Dec. 5, 2017 at 6:00 PM at the Town Hall, 16385 Church Street, Clarendon, NY. Purpose of said hearing is to consider revisions to the town zoning ordinance and zoning map by changing and removing zoning district classifications:

Change zoning classification for the parcels of land located on the corner of Hall Road and 4th Section Road (NYS Rte 31A) - north and south side—from RR (Rural/Residential) to BC (Business/Commercial);

Remove the RR (Rural/Residential) Zoning District designation listed in the ordinance and shown on the zoning district boundary map in its entirety.

Further details of the changes are available at the Town Clerk's Office during business hours. Anyone wishing to be heard in favor of or in opposition to said revisions, will be heard at this hearing.

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD - Meeting Highlights November 2017

On behalf of the Clarendon Community, Supervisor Moy acknowledged the work of Scout Dalton Thurley. His Eagle Scout project was done in the Veteran's Section of the Hillside Cemetery. (*see page 3 of this Gazette*)

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Swanger submitted a written report. The Highway Department has completed the third and final mowing of roadsides, has installed the parking lot for the Historical Society and has the equipment ready for winter. Bids for the new 2017 pick-up truck were opened. Van Bortel was the lowest and best bid. The truck will be delivered the week of November 27th; it will replace the 2004 pick-up.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Dave Griggs submitted a written report. The October 24, 2017 regular meeting was cancelled due to insufficient agenda items.

Regular Meeting November 14, 2017

The Planning Board held a pre-conference for a site plan review (SD17-09) for a one (1) lot subdivision of tax id #121.-1-30.3 Beverly Pape, 1194 LaDue Road for merger with tax id #121.-1-31 Robert Hickock. No issues noted. At the request of the applicant a motion was made, seconded and approved to waive the pre-conference and move to a formal application. A motion was made, seconded and approved to classify this as an exempt subdivision for SEQRA purposes. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve application SD17-09 contingent upon merger of the two lots retained by Mr. Hickock, setting of missing survey pin, creation of deed and filing with the county.

The Planning Board held a pre-conference for a site plan review (SD17-10) for a one (1) lot subdivision of tax id #108.-2-30.121, Bill & Karen DesJardin, 5074 Holley Byron Road for merger with tax id #1090.-1-28.1 Brongo. No issues noted. At the request of the applicant a motion was made, seconded and approved to waive the pre-conference and move to a formal application. A motion was made, seconded and approved to classify this as an exempt subdivision for SEQRA purposes. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve application SD17-10 contingent upon merger of the two lots retained by Mr. Brongo, creation of deed and filing with the county. At the request of the Town Supervisor, the Planning Board reviewed a citizen's request submitted to the Town Board for re-classification of a parcel of land at the corner of Hall Road and Route 31A. General consensus was to support action to re-classify this parcel and an additional portion of another parcel bordered by Route 31A and County Line Road. Chairman Griggs to draft letter.

HISTORIAN/HISTORICAL SOCIETY REPORT

Historian Melissa Ierlan reported that the CHS has speakers lined up for next year. Pictures and old news articles have been donated to the Historian; has been working on archiving them. Judge DiFante's mother, Marlies Adams DiFante, will be speaking to the middle and high school students in Holley on December 1st about her book, Queen of the Bremman and experience in Germany as a child during WWII. The school is currently studying WWI and WWII; this fits in with their curriculum.

SUPERVISOR REPORT

The Town Board accepted a resignation from Sheron Pedley, Zoning Board Deputy-Chair and acknowledged her years of service to the community on the Zoning Board of Appeals. Susan Colby's resignation was accepted as the Town Hall Cleaner; Cindi Davis was appointed to fill the position.

CORRESPONDENCE

The NYS Association of Towns will hold two 'new town officials' schools for training in January 2018; one session will be in Albany, the second in Rochester. Supervisor Moy read aloud from the Seller Settlement by Roy Teitsworth for the surplus highway equipment auctioned off. Total received was \$15,120.00. The Town has received \$1600 for Traffic Diversion Program proceeds for the period of July through September, 2017 and \$32.47 as Clarendon's share of the PILOT program for the railroad going through Clarendon. Supervisor Moy read aloud a letter of discontent from a Thomas Estates resident regarding the new schedule of the RTS Bus Service; this has been forwarded to the appropriate county office.

OLD BUSINESS

The Board adopted SEQR Lead Agency resolutions for both new water projects – WIBA 12 and WD 13. The Hillside Cemetery Chapel project is over 60% complete and looks good. The good weather is helping to keep the progress going. Nothing new has been received regarding the County's purchase of Clarendon rocks. Discussion was held regarding the Cold War Exemption levels. Board members in agreement to keep them the same at 10%/ \$6000 and 50% / \$30,000. Nothing has been received regarding the new County Dog Law. Planning Chairman Griggs explained the proposed zoning changes. There are two parcels on the corner of Hall Road and Route 31A that would be changed to BC (Business/Commercial) keeping the zoning consistent with those parcels around it. Parcels by the cemetery would be changed to RA (Rural/Agricultural) from RR (rural/Residential). Language in the RR district allows for smaller lots in case a developer wanted to build; no developer has come in and it is not foreseeable in the future. It was recommended that the amendments eliminate the RR district completely but the language for reduced lot sizes would be kept in the RA district. The Board set a public hearing for the proposed amendments to be held December 5th at 6PM. After the Public Hearing, the proposal will be sent to the County Planning Board for review and comment.

NEW BUSINESS

The Board approved an amendment to the Town Employee Handbook that adds Personnel Security to those that have access to Criminal Justice information in that a background check and fingerprints be done within 30 days of assignment to a position in the court. The Board adopted a Resolution urging the State to preserve income tax deduction for state and local tax and the town procurement policy was amended to include spending limits in line with General Municipal Law. The Board adopted a Resolution commemorating the 200th Anniversary of the town of Amherst, New York, set to celebrate its Bicentennial in the Year 2018.

Remembering Past Historical Society Members.....



Carl Akeley, considered the father of modern taxidermy, was not only a taxidermist, but also a naturalist, sculptor, writer and inventor. Over his long career he worked for several different museums, including The Field Museum from 1896 to 1909 as Chief Taxidermist. Many of you know that Carl Akeley had his humble beginnings right here in Clarendon, NY. Son of Webb Akeley, he grew up on a small farm on Hinds Road which is commemorated with an historical marker.



Mr. John Janelli has accompanied Mr. George Dante, master museum restorationist to the Field Museum of Natural History in Chicago this week as a taxidermy Historian Consultant. His focus is to interpret Akeley's taxidermy methods and promote outside funding for restoration work. Two professional conservators, Rachael Perkins Arenstein and Eugenie Milroy Parrella are also on this trip to determine the extent of damages and aging of the most significant pachyderms in museum dioramas as only Carl Akeley could have conceived.

It is amazing that almost 100 years after his death, Carl Akeley is still a very important individual and efforts to maintain his great work are ongoing. Clarendon has been done proud by this man I'd have to say!
