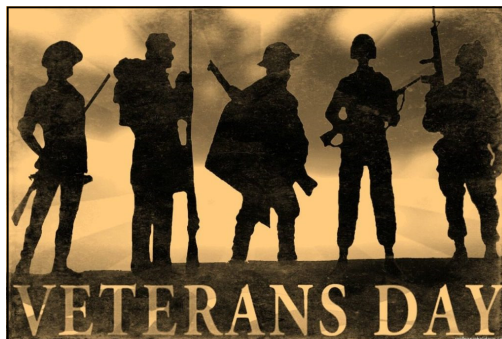

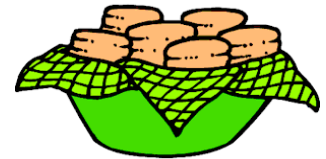
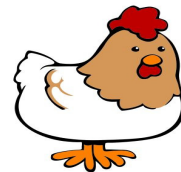

## CLARENDON TOWN BOARD - Meeting Highlights September 2017



The Town Board held a public hearing for comments on the proposed Preliminary Budget for 2018. Town Clerk confirmed no one requested a copy of the budget. Supervisor Moy informed that the budget is good except for the water funds; that needs work. No comments were given on the budget. The Town Board did not accept the budget

at the meeting; will review when corrections are made to the water funds.

### HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Swanger reported the third roadside mowing in progress. Paving and shoulder work has been done on North Manning Road, the west end of Glidden Road and Pumping Station Road. Surplus highway equipment was auctioned bringing \$15,120 in revenue. Water readings should be done tomorrow. The new truck was received last Thursday. The Town Board authorized extra monies received from Pave NY and extreme winter recovery totaling \$44,000 toward paving if the weather holds out; south end of Merrill if the county has time. The Board authorized Superintendent Swanger to put specifications for 2017 or newer pick-up truck out for bid.

### PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Dave Griggs submitted the following written report:

#### Regular Meeting, September 26, 2017

The Planning Board held a pre-conference for a site plan review (SD 17-06) for a one (1) lot subdivision of tax id# 119.-2-55.1 for merger with tax id# 119.-1-28.2, Don Harrington. No issues noted. At the request of the applicant a motion was made, seconded and approved to waive the pre-conference and move to a formal application. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve application SD 17-06 contingent upon merger of the two lots retained by Mr. Harrington and filing of deeds.

Concluded review of Planning Board appointment recommendation for 2018 to the Town of Clarendon and a motion was made, seconded and approved to submit them to the town for their review and approval.

#### Regular Meeting October 10, 2017

The Planning Board held a pre-conference for a site plan review (SD 17-08) for a (1) lot subdivision of tax id# 99.-1-5, Harry Warren, 4504 Bennetts Corners Road. No issues noted. At the request of the applicant a motion was made, seconded and approved to waive the pre-conference and move to a formal application. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve application SD 17-08 contingent upon filing of deeds.

The Planning Board held a pre-conference for a site plan review (SD 17-07) for a Mixed occupancy business (rental apartment, office space, service business) proposed at 15549 East Lee Road, tax id# 97.-1-44.2, Adam Johnson, co-owner CATT Group LLC. After review no significant issues were noted. At the request of the applicant a motion was made, seconded and approved to waive the pre-conference and move to a formal application. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve application SD 17-07 contingent upon 1- agreement of all parties on conditions of approval and 2- resolution of any outstanding violations of the Town of Clarendon Zoning Ordinance against the property located at 15549 East Lee Road.

Concluded review of new Zoning Ordinance language proposed to the Town of Clarendon for their review and approval. (See Notice on front page of this Gazette.)

### HISTORIAN/HISTORICAL SOCIETY REPORT

Historian and CHS President Melissa Ierlan presented photos to the board of the old Veterans section of the Hillside Cemetery. Before and after photos showed the work done by Dalton Thurley for his Eagle Scout project. Gravestones were power washed, cleaned and straightened. Medina Sandstone was spread around the gravestones and some of the flags replaced. There was a tall family monument in the shape of an obelisk which had been vandalized several years ago. This person was a Civil War Soldier killed at the battle of Little Round Top, Gettysburg PA. Dalton used the new equipment purchased by the Town of Clarendon to set the top back on the stone. The chapel roof project should be complete in two weeks. Tomorrow the program at the CHS will be on Charles Howard and the Santa Claus School. This will be the last CHS program for the year. Bob Barrett lent a Santa suit purchased in 1980 from Charles Howard's shop.

### SUPERVISOR REPORT

Supervisor Moy reported that Deputy Clerk Joni Robishaw has passed her Notary Public Exam; there will always be a Notary available in the Clerk's Office now. Supervisor reminded all of the November 7<sup>th</sup> election and reviewed the proposals that will be on the ballot.

### CORRESPONDENCE

The Orleans County Department of Personnel and Self-Insurance has sent notice of the Self-Insurance quarterly meeting. Orleans county Board of Elections has sent election information; The Town received \$11,416.00 in State Aid and \$14,285.71 from Monroe County Probation for restitution in Court Loss. NYS Department of Financial Services has sent information about new legislation confronting vacant and abandoned property.

### OLD BUSINESS

The Board authorized Labella Associates to complete the environmental review and applications for funding to Rural Development for Water 12 and 13 projects. Chatfield Engineers was authorized to prepare engineering reports for the same projects.

### NEW BUSINESS

Fred Seeman III was appointed to a five-year seat on the Zoning Board; term to expire 12/31/2022. Discussion was held regarding an increase in the Cold War Veteran Tax Exemption allowed. Currently it's at 10%. The Board will check with the Assessor to see what other towns are doing. The Supervisor's roll-top desk was declared surplus equipment. Supervisor Moy wants to donate the roll-top desk used by Clarendon founder Eldridge Farwell that was passed down to him through his family. The Town Board approved application for out of District User to Water Improvement Benefit Area #10 for property located at 4640 County Line Road in the Town of Sweden. Amy DiFante was reappointed to a five year seat on the Board of Assessment Review; Term to expire 9/30/2022 and the Board recommended to the County Legislature that Kevin Johnson be reappointed full-representative to the County Planning Board; Russ Bosch as alternate-representative to the County Planning Board. Planning Chairman Griggs summarized the proposed amendments to the zoning ordinance and a public hearing was scheduled for 11/21/17 prior to the regular meeting. Supervisor reported his conversation with National Grid regarding motorized vehicles on the power lines. National Grid will post no trespassing. They indicated to Supervisor Moy there is no record of permission to snowmobilers to use the power lines.

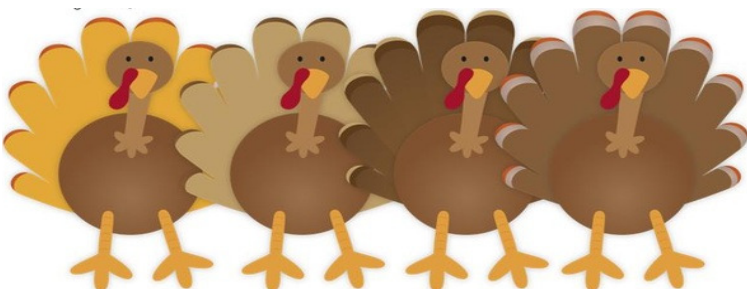

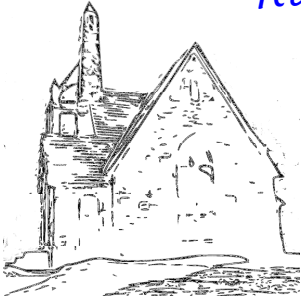

This month we would like to feature the Veteran's Section of Hillside Cemetery. In 1938 a committee was formed by the Orleans County Supervisors after a request by the Orleans County American Legion Posts. A decision was made to purchase 250

graves in various Orleans county cemeteries for veterans to be buried since the current designated areas were overcrowded.

48 plots were purchased at Hillside Cemetery for use by veterans. Clarendon, Murray and Holley have always in my mind been very conscious of their veterans and do various activities throughout the year to honor vets.

School children and other organizations and clubs seem to do many things to help out or recognize our veterans. Parades are very important in this community and the Memorial Day Parade is always very well attended.



The program is organized by the American Legion and VFW and the stop in Hillside shows just how much our veterans mean to us. There are boy scouts and the honor guard as well as retired servicemen and women. The ceremony has school children involved and of course the honor guard does a gun salute.

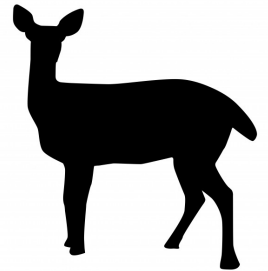

- November 1<sup>st</sup> starts the First Come, First Served (FCFS) Deer Management Permit (DMP) process. Please keep in mind the following important points about the FCFS DMP process:
- Hunters may apply for and receive up to two additional DMPs in these WMUs.
- Applicants with licenses that are exempt from paying a DMP application fee or hunters who have previously applied for DMPs this license year will not be charged any additional fees during the extended application period. Otherwise, there is a non-refundable \$10 application fee for leftover DMPs.
- **Leftover DMPs are issued on a first-come / first-serve basis.** DEC will continue to issue permits in these WMUs until sufficient numbers of DMPs are issued to achieve optimum management in each unit. When a unit is opened, it will remain open at least until close of business that day. At the end of the business day, any units that have reached the desired number of permits will be closed.
- Applications for leftover DMPs will not affect any preference points held by the applicant.
- DMPs are only valid for antlerless deer in the WMU for which they are issued.

### PROPOSALS THAT WILL BE ON THE BACK OF THE BALLOT

1. **NYS Constitution Convention:** Shall there be a convention to revise the State Constitution and amend the same?
2. **Allowing the complete or partial forfeiture of a public officer's pension if he or she is convicted of a certain type of felony.** The proposed amendment to section 7 of Article 5 of the State Constitution would allow a court to reduce or revoke the public pension of a public officer who is convicted of a felony that has a direct & actual relationship to the performance of the public officer's existing duties. Shall the proposed amendment be approved?
3. **Authorizing the Use of Forest Preserve Land for Specified Purposes.** The proposed amendment will create a land account with up to 250 acres of forest preserve land eligible for use by towns, villages and counties that have no viable alternative to using forest preserve land to address specific public health & safety concerns; as a substitute for the land removed from the forest preserve, another 250 acres of land, will be added to the forest preserve, subject to legislative approval. The proposed amendment also will allow bicycle trails & certain public utility lines to be located within the width of specified highways that cross the forest preserve while minimizing removal of trees and vegetation. Shall the proposed amendment be approved?

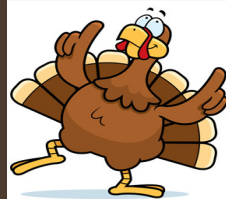

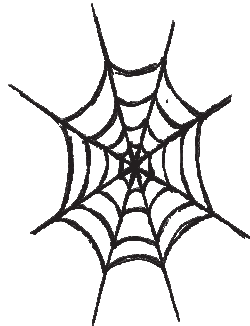
