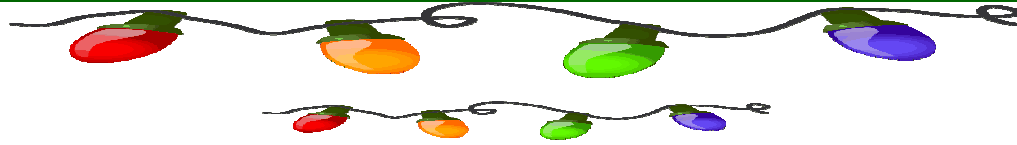

The Town Board has adopted the 2016 Town Budget. It remains under the State mandated tax cap; new Town Tax Rate has been lowered to \$4.79 per thousand.

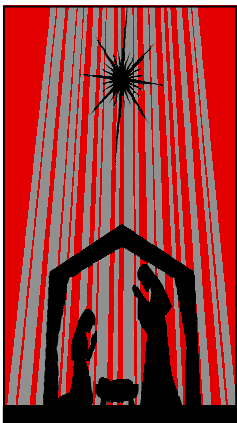

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD—Meeting Highlights November 2015

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPT REPORT

Superintendent Larry Swanger reported that Taylor Road between Bennetts Corners and South Holley Road is paved. Shoulders were put on the Bennetts Corners Road. The new truck is in. The plow and wing were delivered a couple days ago. The highway crew has been working on the roofing project; the entire west side and addition to the garage is complete. A service line on Upper Holley Road, south of Brown Schoolhouse Road was repaired. The plug was still in the main line blocking the water; it has been repaired. Fifteen services were hooked up to Water Improvement Benefit Area 11 water main last month; a total of 37 so far out of 79. Paul Burley is done working in the cemetery for the season. Superintendent Swanger reported he may be able to get the county excavator next week to use on the barn on Church Street. Superintendent Swanger confirmed that he did mention to the engineer that from 31A into the Village of Holley on South Holley Road (county road), the road is 'beat up' – near Maple Grove Farm. If the contractor ripped up the road, he's liable.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Dave Griggs reported his discussion with OIO Ierlan regarding the fee schedule items that involve the Planning Board; Dave sees nothing that should be changed. Clarendon is in line with Ogden, Dewitt and Murray for the most part.

HISTORIAN/HISTORICAL SOCIETY REPORT

Historian Melissa Ierlan submitted the following written report: The museum has been winterized. The Hillside Chapel has been cleaned out but a patch needs to be fixed over the broken window there. The last Historical Society meeting for 2015 will be tomorrow at 7:00 PM with election for trustees. Bill Lattin's book signing was well attended; Melissa attended and has several copies of his book. Historian Ierlan has a meeting on Thursday with the County Historian and local Historians. Melissa attended Collin Nothnagle's Eagle Scout Ceremony on Sunday. She has potentially lined up two new Eagle Projects; One to benefit Hillside Cemetery and one to benefit the Clarendon schoolhouse museum. Historian Ierlan is still working with college and high school students on other projects. Busy! All good stuff.

CORRESPONDENCE

Erie County Health Laboratory Services will raise their rates effective 1/1/2016. The Orleans County Economic Development Agency Falls Rail Road PILOT program payment of \$32.47 was received. Orleans County has sent a letter to the NYS Department of Transportation regarding state owned canal infrastructure and assets. Supervisor informed that Orleans County has more canal bridges that anywhere else in New York State. NYS Municipal Insurance Reciprocal has adjusted their rates for 2015-2016 with an increase of \$300. Clarendon received \$15,460.65 as the town's share of the Orleans County Mortgage Tax Distribution from receipts received from April 1 through September 30, 2015. Association of Towns has sent notice of 2016 training opportunities. The American Public Works Association has sent a request for nominations of outstanding public works projects for their annual awards. Clarendon received \$2533.33 for Traffic Diversion Proceeds from July through September 2015. MVP has sent Notice of Group Renewal and 2016 Premium Rates. The Town's representative was at the Town Hall last week; we will have a 1.49% increase. A partial payment of \$190.00 has been received toward the cemetery restitution balance due.

OLD BUSINESS

Superintendent Swanger reported the water is flowing in WIBA 11; that a couple hydrant markers are missing and that top soil will be completed in the spring. This past month there was three hook-ups in WD3 and some in WD5 and WD7 also. The Board adopted a Final Order Establishing Water District No. 9 Extension 1. Supervisor Moy referenced the agreement received back from Monroe County Water Authority, noting that changes were in red; that MCWA will not have antennas on towers; if there is one on it, they want the royalties to pay for maintenance needed. It was stated that maintenance needed due on an antenna can be charged back to the cell provider whose antenna it is. If there is a free standing antenna, MCWA will split the revenue with the town. MCWA has Byron Water; Byron is installing PVC lines and need to put \$25/parcel each year, into an account specified for water line replacement. Supervisor Moy acknowledged his intention to have another water informational meeting with residents regarding Monroe County Water Authority. It has been estimated the cost to paint the water tower will be \$500,000. If the town keeps control of the public water, board members in agreement that it needs to change; In January MCWA will charge us \$3.06 per thousand and we charge the customer \$3.25. There isn't enough revenue for the town to maintain the lines.

The Town Board approved amending the preliminary budget as follows: General Fund Contingency Account 1990.40 down \$10,000 from \$64,920 to \$54,920 and Transportation General Repairs Account 5110.40 down \$20,000 from \$240,000 to \$220,000. These changes will keep the town budget under the tax cap. The final budget was adopted with the changes. Supervisor Moy read aloud item by item, the changes proposed in the fee schedule. Town Board adopted the proposed amendments. Bob Clarke was appointed as full member of the Zoning Board of Appeals term to expire 12/31/2018 and Eric Bradshaw was appointed as full member of the Planning Board term to expire 12/31/2016. Supervisor suggested that the Zoning Ordinance be amended; Article III Section 301: Mandating that all structures in the Town of Clarendon require a building permit (regardless of size). Supervisor stated with the current zoning allowing structures under 145 sq. feet to not need a building permit, the town has no control of placement on the lot; that some people think that if no permit is required, it won't be assessed. That's not true. Currently re-roofing does not need a permit; the code requires ice shield and some contractors are not doing it. Planning Board will do further review for any additional changes. . A public hearing will be scheduled prior to adoption.

The Town Board authorized Supervisor Moy to sign a five-year renewal/extension of the Joint Youth Recreation Agreement with the Holley School, Town of Murray and Village of Holley.

Hillside Sketches

On a back terrace in Hillside Cemetery you will find a tall monument for the Taylor family. This monument must have been quite attractive when new. Sadly, vandals removed its cap stone and threw it down the terrace. It has been retrieved and is waiting to be replaced at the top of the shaft. Lately, one member of that family has garnered some well-deserved and belated attention. His personal grave marker sits just west of the family monument. If you participated in this year's Ghost Walk, you had the opportunity to learn about **Private Herbert Charles Taylor** from his father's "ghost", aptly portrayed by Derek Maxfield, a professor at Genesee Community College.

Pvt. Taylor was the only soldier from Orleans County who lost his life in that most famous Civil War battle at Gettysburg. As a member of the New York's 140th Volunteer Infantry, Taylor was present on Little Round Top on July 2nd, 1863. From the top of the hill, the men looked down into the area known as Devil's



Den where Confederates from Texas were prepared to do battle. The 140th made a stunningly brave attack and overcame the Texans, thus making a tremendous contribution towards the Union victory. Orleans County Historian, Matt Ballard, has called the men of the 140th the "unsung heroes of Little Round Top". Unfortunately, our own Pvt. Taylor was one of the men who lost his life in this confrontation. The seventh graders in Albion have been studying Civil War soldiers from Orleans County, including Herbert Taylor. They would like to place a historical marker at his gravesite recognizing his sacrifice. This would be a fine addition to Hillside Cemetery and an important reminder of how the Civil War affected our county.

HOLLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT PARTNERS WITH ORLEANS COUNTY MENTAL HEALTH TO OFFER SATELLITE OFFICE

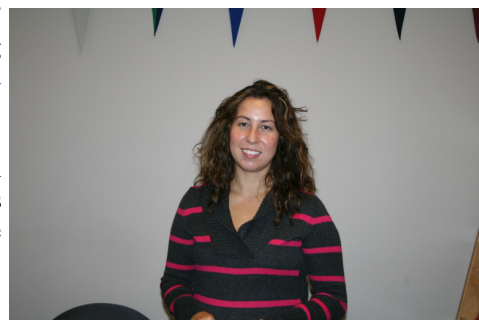
In response to the national concern about mental health issues and the impact they have on student performance and school district climates, Holley Central School District has partnered with Orleans County Mental Health to offer a satellite office at Holley Middle School/High School (MS/HS) two days a week. Nicole Ashton, an Orleans County Mental Health Counselor, works out of the satellite office at Holley on Wednesdays and Fridays from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. “This is a real boost for our side of the county to offer mental health services here,” said Holley Superintendent Robert D’Angelo. “This saves our families travel time to come here instead of Albion, plus it augments the services provided by our district’s counseling staff. By having the satellite office at the MS/HS, students can use the services provided to help them concentrate on their studies and be positive contributors in school. This new service opportunity also encourages our parents to further engage with the district on students’ academic issues.”

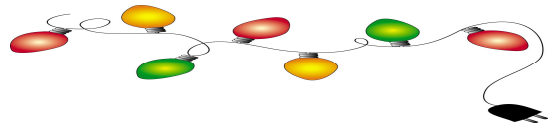
Since Oct. 7, Ashton has begun to make assessments of students, offer counseling appointments and give referrals to other mental health professionals to help address the needs of students and their families. Students are referred to her by Holley faculty and staff or a parent/guardian request. After receiving the referral or request, she begins the process by obtaining parent/guardian permission and insurance information, then scheduling an hour-long initial assessment. Once the assessment is complete, she works with the student’s schedule to make regular appointments. For appointments scheduled after school, students can utilize the 5 p.m. bus for a ride home.

“The school district support here in Holley is amazing,” said Ashton. “I have been welcomed by the students and staff. The district personnel have been helpful with providing information on students and tracking their progress. I’m here to serve the needs of the students and families, so I try to be flexible to set appointments with the hours and days that fit their schedules.” Ashton has a Master’s degree as a Licensed Master Social Worker and a Bachelor’s degree in Alcohol and Substance Abuse Counseling.

Ashton is a Holley alumnus and worked as an intern for Holley MS/HS Social Worker Samantha Zelent when she was pursuing her master’s degree. “She built such great connections with the kids when she was here,” said Zelent. “Many of them would tell me that they would only seek outside counseling if it was through Nicole. She has a special way of connecting with the students and their families. Having her here is a huge asset.”

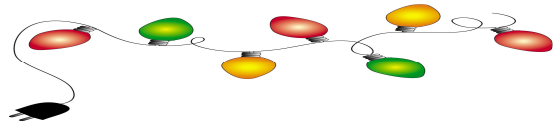

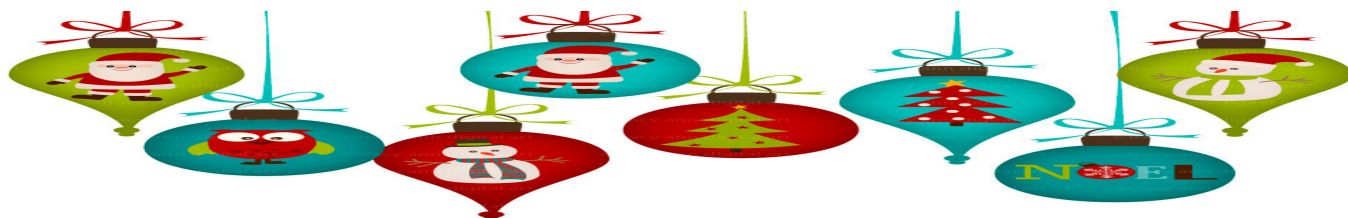
