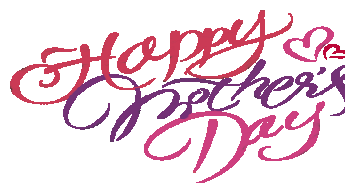

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD—Meeting Highlights April 2017

The Clarendon Town Board held a public hearing on April 18th prior to the regular meeting. Purpose of the hearing was to consider amendments to the zoning ordinance. Deputy Supervisor Robinson read aloud proof of notice, giving specific amendments to be considered. A resident questioned the Article VII Motor Vehicle Repair Shop correction; asking for clarification on the 200 foot distance. Planning Chairman Griggs stated that it refers to the front set-back – 200 feet to center line of road. Pre-existing repair shops are grandfathered with their amount of frontage. The proposed change will correct a typing error. Two hundred is spelled out in words, but numbers in parenthesis showed as (20). This will correct it to read (200).

The Mosiers from Powerline Road reviewed their past and present concerns regarding gravel, shoulder grading, lawn restoration and the mess left from winter plowing and reported past damage to his apple trees from plowing. He felt that the sweeper used by the highway department will not fit under the pine tree limbs without damage to remove the stones and gravel left there from the snow plow wing. Mr. Mosier reported raking his frontage again this year and removing 6 bobcat buckets of stone; that 30 feet off the road, the stone is deep into his yard. Mr. Mosier reported having to fix his lawn every year, costing him money. Councilman Robinson did visit Mr. Mosier to view his property. Mr. Mosier recently reported to the Town Clerk that tires were dropped along the side of the Powerline Road; that two town trucks drove by and didn't pick up the tires. Mr. Mosier stated that he has called Superintendent Swanger and left messages, but has not received a call back; that Mr. Mosier attended this board meeting to handle the problem and Superintendent Swanger was not present. The Mosiers questioned the cost to the tax payers to have the highway department take down a barn on Church Street that was 300 feet off the road. It was confirmed that the Code Enforcement Officer had deemed the barn unsafe and it had to be taken down. Mr. Mosier mentioned the two trees on Hinds Road that residents felt were dangerous and in the town right-of-way last year; that Superintendent Swanger did not schedule use of the county bucket truck to take the trees down and they came down across the road in the last wind storm. Mr. Mosier questioned the Superintendent's abilities, communication skills, salary and accountability to the residents. Councilman Robinson stated that when Supervisor Moy returns in May, he will discuss the situation; that the board won't discuss this until then. Councilmen felt this issue shouldn't even be brought to the Town Board; that the Superintendent is an elected official and handles complaints. Mr. Mosier requested being notified of the meeting when the board will discuss it so he can attend.

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Swanger submitted a written report. The Highway crew has been mostly working on brush and tree clean up in the cemeteries and lawn repair. The snow equipment has been put away for the summer and there was one burial last month. Councilman Robinson confirmed that there is a lot of damage in the cemeteries; Hibbard Road Cemetery is cleaned up - done by the highway crew with some help from the Village of Holley.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Dave Griggs submitted the following written report:

Regular Meeting March 28, 2017- A pre-conference was held SD 17-04 for a site plan review One (1) lot subdivision of 50' x 200' piece of land by Patricia Giglio, 4125 South Holley Road, tax id# 87.-4-23.1 to be merged with 4111 South Holley Road tax id# 87.-4-22.11. Chairman Griggs reviews the application with the board (the driveway for 4111 South Holley Road was technically on the wrong lot). No issues were noted with the proposal. There is a letter requesting to waive the pre-conference if the board sees no issues with the application. A motion was made, seconded and passed to move from a pre-conference to a formal stage. A motion seconded and passed to move from a pre-conference to a formal stage. A motion was made, seconded and passed to approved one lot subdivision contingent upon filing of deed and merger of

Lot. A pre-conference was held ,SP 17-01, for Special Permit Gary Casale ,GMC Industries, 5278 Holley Byron Road tax id# 120.-1-1.1. Chairman Griggs reviews the application with the board. He informs them that this was a previously existing special permit and the applicant wishes to reestablish the business in the same manner. There are Ag and Market rules that apply to the business and the applicant Mr. Casale is in the process of that application as well. The foot print will be identical to the original. A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the 12-05-2002 SEQRA that was performed on this site. A motion was made, seconded and passed to hold a public hearing prior to the April 11 PB meeting. Mr. Casale waves the pre-conference. A motion was made, seconded and passed to move from a pre-conference to a formal stage. Further action tabled. **Public Hearing April 11, 2017-** A public hearing was held for SP 17-01 for Special Permit Gary Casale ,GMC Industries, 5278 Holley Byron Road tax id# 120.-1-1.1. No one spoke either for or against the proposal. **Regular Meeting April 11, 2017 -** Continued review of SP 17-01 for Special Permit Gary Casale ,GMC Industries, 5278 Holley Byron Road tax id# 120.-1-1.1. Chairman Griggs reviews the application with the board. No issues were noted during the public hearing. No issues were noted with this proposal. A motion was made, seconded and passed to approve SP 17-01 contingent upon verification of appropriate AG & Markets requirements and approval of Orleans County Health Department Inspection by the OIO.

HISTORIAN/CHS REPORT

Historian Ierlan submitted the following written report: I visited the Holley High School Art Class and Miss Neadow their teacher and talked to them about the old post cards that were popular in the early 1900's around the area. Helped them to secure funds from the PTSA and have their original designs printed professionally through Vista Print. They sold them as a fund raiser. Another Eagle Project was completed by Will Harrington. He had 2 twenty foot walls constructed and track lighting installed for new display areas in the barn on the second story. Two students Collin Nothnagle and Rebecca Kinsey helped to stain the walls and paint another sign. Fred and Kyle helped install the soapbox derby car for display and we hung the collage of soap box pics from over the years done by Collin. Collin repaired the rope on the flag pole and Fred cut down dead branches from a tree out in front of the barn.

Tomorrow is our first meeting at the Historical Society. Our talk will be on The Clarendon Cheese Factory. I have been invited back to run a station at the Holley Elementary 4th grade pioneer days. We will make whirligigs.; a fun toy that we did last year. On May 20, 2017 there will be a dedication ceremony for the Lemuel Cook Historical Marker in the Cook Cemetery on Munger Road.

SUPERVISOR REPORT

Deputy Supervisor Allen Robinson reported that the NYSDOT has completed their review of Route 31A relative to extending the 35 mph speed limit easterly from the hamlet. Speed Zone Ahead Warning signs will be installed in advance of the first speed limit sign and the first 35 MPH speed limit sign in each direction will be replaced with a larger, more visible sign. This work will be done by the NYSDOT maintenance forces as weather and work schedules allow. The BAN for Water Districts 10, 11 and 9 ext. and the dump and plow trucks were bid out for renewal. Last year the interest rate was .9%; this year it is 2.25%.

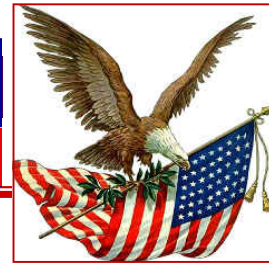

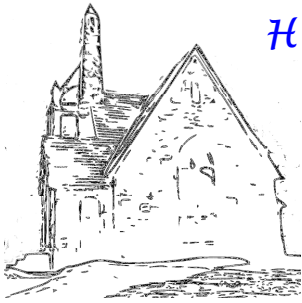

Jessie Eloise Salisbury married Ward Byron Akeley, brother of famed taxidermist Carl Akeley in Clarendon, NY on March 27, 1900. They moved to and lived in Illinois until 1915. They were divorced on December 27, 1915. One child was born to the couple and his name was Baron Field Akeley. He was 11 when his parents were divorced. Carl Akeley was very close to Jessie and Field (as he called him) especially after the divorce. Carl often sent letters to Jessie that began with "My Dearest Jessie" and signed "with much love to you both and one hundred kisses to Field". When Ward Akeley left his wife and child, Carl Akeley made sure they were taken care of. He sent a letter offering his lawyer to represent her in the divorce. He also stated that the lawyer would make "W" appear with the request of support for his son in court. After Carl Akeley died, his wife Mary continued to write to Jessie and Field. It was very evident that Carl thought so much of his brother's ex-wife and his nephew and did his best to be a part of their lives.



It appears from newspaper articles that Jessie resided in a home with her brother in Clarendon in 1934. Their parents were deceased at this time. Her son was attending Union College in Schenectady and visited his mother quite often.

Jessie Salisbury Akeley died on May 6, 1942 and was buried in the family plot in Hillside Cemetery.

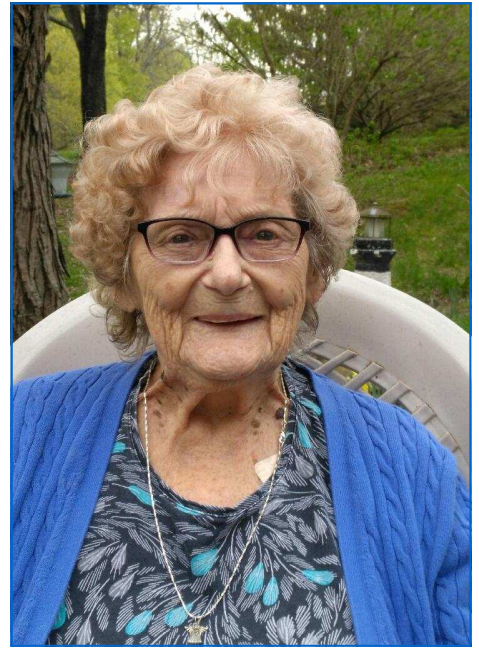

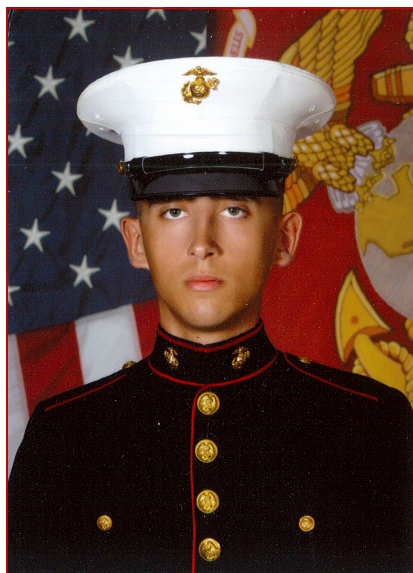
