FLU! One Hundred Years Ago

The Clarendon Historical Society invites you to hear **Daniel D. Cody, M.A.** present **The 1918 Influenza Epidemic** on **Wednesday, July 18 at 7:00 PM.**

In the fall of 1918 the Great War was coming to an end. However, another war was just starting. This was the war against Influenza, an epidemic that killed millions worldwide in just a few short months. Rochester was not immune from the ravages of influenza. This presentation explores how Rochester dealt with the epidemic they knew was coming and would be deadly. **Daniel D. Cody** is employed as Collections Manager and Registrar for the Rochester Historical Society. He is also an adjunct lecturer of American History at the Finger Lakes Community College.

The program will take place at the Clarendon Historical Society which is located at 16426 Fourth Section Road, Holley, NY at the intersection of Route 31A and Church Street in Clarendon. The presentations are free and open to the public, so bring a friend! Light refreshments will be served.

Remember: The Museum will be open from 5:00-7:00 PM on the days we have programming (the 3rd Wednesday of the month beginning in April and going through October.)



CLARENDON TOWN BOARD - Meeting Highlights June 2018

OPEN END

County Legislator E. John DeFilipps informed the Board that the Legislature can't entertain the rock purchase until they get approval from FEMA for the money.

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Larry Swanger reported that the Village of Holley helped with its bucket truck in Hillside Cemetery. Ten trees have been removed; five were in the village electric lines. The first roadside mowing is complete. The Highway crew has been helping other towns with paving and there were two burials this past month. There is a service line water leak on Route 31A; approximately 1 ½ million gallons lost. A contractor is coming to put a new line under the road; it will be PVC. This is the third one in a row to leak. The hot soil wears holes in the copper pipe. There have been 10 leaks in the Hamlet over the last 13 years. Most towns having water problems are using PVC to fix them.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Dave Griggs submitted the following written report:

05-22-2018 (Regular meeting)

Meeting cancelled for lack of agenda items.

06-12-2018 (Regular Meeting)

* **SD 18-11** Gary Germeo, 4318 S. Fancher Road. Pre-conference for a one (1) lot subdivision, tax id #97.-2-1.1. Application on file, fee paid, Pins have been set. No issues were noted. The applicant requested in writing to wave pre-conference and proceed to formal application. A motion was made, seconded and approved to change the agenda from a pre-conference to a formal. A motion was made, seconded and approved to classify this subdivision as a minor subdivision for SEQRA purposes. A motion was made, seconded and approved to grant the one (1) lot subdivision contingent upon creation of deeds and filing with the County.

SUPERVISOR REPORT

Supervisor Moy reported all the street lights have been converted to LED. They look nice.

CORRESPONDENCE

The Town has received the lease agreement payment from Nick Penna to farm Hillside Property. NYSDOT has sent notice of \$100 million in available funding. NYS Taxation and finance has sent notice that the tentative equalization rate is 100%. Payment of Orleans County Mortgage Tax Apportionment from October 1, 2017 through March 30, 2018 was received in the amount of \$16,306.76. MVP has sent notice of requested 6.44% premium rate increase for health care from the NYS Department of Financial Services.

OLD BUSINESS

Supervisor Moy and Councilman Robinson attended the Murray Town Board meeting to request monetary payment toward the painting of the water tower. The Town of Murray gets its water pressure through the Clarendon tower. A letter will be sent for Murray's contemplation when an amount is figured. The Town Board adopted a resolution consenting to assign Chatfield Engineers contracts to MRB Group; the companies are merging. A letter will be sent to the Town of Barre regarding renewal of our emergency water agreement with Barre. The Board put a hold on Charter Communications draft franchise agreement. Supervisor Moy has written a letter to Monroe County Water Authority in response to their proposed retail lease agreement; MCWA has not yet responded.

NEW BUSINESS

The Board scheduled a workshop meeting to review sections of the zoning ordinance. The Board adopted resolutions authorizing an amendment to the Snow & Ice Agreement with NYS and to support legislation to increase financial resources to veterans' agencies. The Board approved the final payment for masonry exterior work on the Chapel at Hillside Cemetery.

A Workshop Meeting was held and zoning items discussed. The Board was in agreement to leave Seasonal Dwelling Permits out of the ordinance; in agreement to allow the increase of lot size of a non-conforming lot and to allow accessory structures on vacant lots without a residence, specifying that it be non-habitable, for personal use only and must comply with NYS Property Maintenance Code. Planning Chairman Griggs will prepare draft language for the next Town Board meeting.



Brian Bartalo named Holley School Superintendent

The Holley Board of Education has selected Brian Bartalo as the next superintendent of the Holley Central School District pending formal appointment to the position at the next Board of Education meeting on June 18, 2018. He will assume his new role July 16, 2018.

“Throughout the rigorous search process, Brian demonstrated an ability to connect with students, staff and community members,” said Board President Brenda Swanger. “His long experience and track record of success make him the ideal leader to move our district forward.” Bartalo is currently the principal and International Baccalaureate Head of School at Hilton High School, a post he has held since 2005. From 1999 until 2005, Bartalo was an assistant principal at Hilton HS. Prior to that, he served for one year as the dean of students at Hilton HS. In 1988, Bartalo began his teaching career as a special education teacher at Merton Williams Middle School in the Hilton Central School District, where he taught and coached until 1998. “The Holley community has been very welcoming to me through this search process,” said Bartalo. “I look forward to working with the Board to further the district’s mission of instilling a passion for lifelong learning within our students.”
