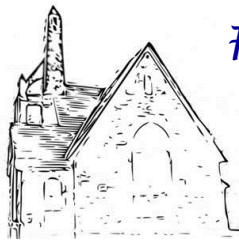

## Hillside Sketches

### Chase Richardson

(1810-1839) is buried in Hillside cemetery. Since the cemetery was not formed until 1866, one has to wonder where Chase was buried prior to being interred in Hillside.

This broadside states: Holley Cabinet Ware House- C. Richardson, would



inform the people of Holley, and vicinity, that he still continues the Cabinet Making business 3 doors south of Pery's Tavern, where he will manufacture and keep constantly on hand, a general assortment of Mahogany and Cherry Cabinet Furniture. Ellen Maria (Richardson)

Cowles (1838-1873) of Clarendon, may have been the daughter

or niece of the cabinet maker C. Richardson. At the beginning of the 19th century, the furniture industry in America saw a sudden shift of its epicenter from Philadelphia to New York. Dubbed the "London of America," it was thought at the time that New York would in fact be the leader in business in the United States. To facilitate the cabinetmaking industry a new directory for cabinetmakers in New York was published in 1805



and various guides were issued helping craftsmen to price their furniture. Styles were elegant and influenced highly by the European furniture which was also being imported into New York. Phyfe, Allison, and Ash produced some of the finest examples of furniture from that period. However, although the high styles of the time may have been determined by these well-known cabinetmakers, others imitated and added their own interpretations.



## Joanne French to Speak at CHS

The Clarendon Historical Society invites you to join them on **Wednesday, June 20 at 7:00 PM** when **Joanne French** will present **Two Remarkable Women of Rochester: Matilda Harper and Kate Gleason.**

Martha Matilda Harper, a domestic servant, developed a business model that would enable women to achieve financial independence. She opened the first public hair salon in the region and became one of the first businesspeople in America to start franchising, allowing franchisees to open salons under the Harper name. Each franchise was run by a woman. Her own floor-length hair served as an effective marketing tool and appeared in many advertisements for her products. Many of her innovations, including the Harper Method, underlie the modern concept of the hair salon. In 2003, Harper was inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame for her achievements in business.

Kate Gleason, the first woman to attend The College of Engineering at Cornell, brought innovation and international sales to Gleason Works. Known for her engineering prowess, she developed a method of pouring concrete to build houses and oversaw the financing and construction of several factories. She was the first woman elected to full membership in the American Society of Mechanical Engineers. In addition, she was an astute business woman, a humanitarian, philanthropist and suffragist. The [Kate Gleason College of Engineering](#) at RIT is named in her honor, and Kate Gleason Hall is an RIT residence hall.

**Joanne French** lives with her family in Spencerport. She enjoys being an active member of the community, having volunteered extensively at the Spencerport Central School, the Susan B. Anthony House and Sojourner House. She is currently the Library Store Coordinator at the Rundell Library in Rochester.

The program will take place at the Clarendon Historical Society which is located at 16426 Fourth Section Road, Holley, NY at the intersection of Route 31A and Church Street in Clarendon. The presentation is free and open to the public, so bring a friend! Light refreshments will be served.

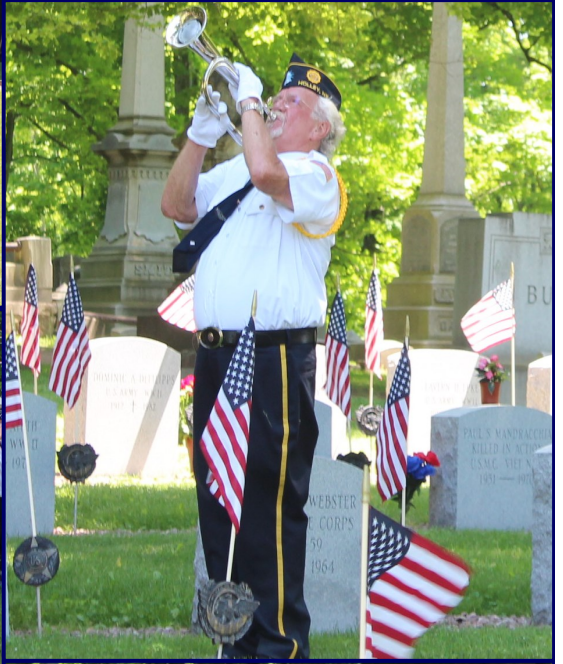

## CLARENDON TOWN BOARD - Meeting Highlights May 2018

### HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Larry Swanger reported that the winter equipment has been painted and stored for the summer. Highway Employees attended safety classes and repairs are being done on equipment. The roads have been graded and the highway crew is working on fixing potholes. There were four burials this past month and the County Highway helped with grinding down tree stumps. A fire hydrant on the highway was damaged in an accident; that has been repaired. A main water valve was found leaking at the end of Manning Road; it has been repaired. Six water samples have been taken each from Water Improvement Benefit Area 12 and Water District 13. Superintendent Swanger submitted an itemized receipt from Roy Teitsworth Auction in Palmyra for surplus equipment auctioned. Amounts received as follows: Troy-bilt garden way walk-behind string trimmer \$150.00; Stone 3" trash pump w/hose \$50.00; 2004 Chevy 1500 extended cab pickup, 4WD, gas, automatic, PW, PL, PM, /C, CD, cruise, 140k \$2700.00; 1993 Ford Ambulance, diesel, automatic, PW, PL, A/C, cruise, 65K \$1800.00.

**PLANNING BOARD REPORT** – David R. Griggs, Chairman submitted the following written report: **04-24-2018 (public Hearing)** Chairman Griggs opened the Public Hearing at 7:00 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance. Chairman Griggs read aloud the advertisement for the public hearing regarding Special Use Permit for Brandon St. John, owner of 4552 Holley Byron Road tax id# 98.13-1-38.1. Chairman Griggs asked three times if there were any persons wishing to be heard in favor or against this application. No one spoke. Public hearing was closed at 7:05 pm and the regular meeting commenced. **04-24-2018 (Regular meeting) SD 18-04, Pre-conference, Lori Johnson Pre-Conference for site plan review to construct a 24' x 26' pole barn, 5789 Upper Holley Road.** Applicant meets the setbacks required for the construction of the pole barn, no issues noted. A written request to waive the pre-conference has been made by the applicant. A motion was made, seconded and approved to amend application from a pre-conference to a formal application for SD 18-04. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve SD 18-04 as submitted. **SP 05-01, Special Permit Renewal, Christopher Neff, Auto Repair Shop 5360 Upper Holley Road.** Fee paid, Inspected, No outstanding complaints. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve renewal. **05-08-2018 (Regular Meeting) SD 18-05** David Rotoli/Carol Contardi, 4283 Holley Byron Road. Pre-conference for a one (1) lot subdivision/ merger, tax id #87.-3-55.21. Pins have been set. One minor issue was noted. The applicant requested in writing to wave pre-conference and proceed to formal application. A motion was made, seconded and approved to change the agenda from a pre-conference to a formal. A motion was made, seconded and approved to classify this subdivision as a minor subdivision for SEQRA purposes. A motion was made, seconded and approved to grant the one (1) lot subdivision contingent on relocation of existing storage shed on retained parcel to meet district side setback requirements (25 feet), creation of deeds and filing with County. **SD 18-06** Michael Odeychuk, 4335 Holley Byron Road. Pre-conference for a one (1) lot subdivision/ merger, tax id #87.-3-19.117. Pins have been set. No issues were noted. The applicant requested in writing to wave pre-conference and proceed to formal application. A motion was made, seconded and approved to change the agenda from a pre-conference to a formal. A motion was made, seconded and approved to classify this subdivision as a minor subdivision for SEQRA purposes. A motion was made, seconded and approved to grant the one (1) lot subdivision contingent on creation of deeds and filing with County, and merger of newly created parcel (2) with existing parcel (3) tax id #87.-3-27.223. **SD 18-06** Duane Feor, 4673 Bennetts Corners Road. Pre-conference for a one (1) lot subdivision, tax id # 99.-1-50.111.

It was noted that some pins have not been set. No other issues were noted. The applicant requested in writing to wave pre-conference and proceed to formal application. A motion was made, seconded and approved to change the agenda from a pre-conference to a formal. A motion was made, seconded and approved to classify this subdivision as a minor subdivision for SE-QRA purposes. A motion was made, seconded and approved to grant the one (1) lot subdivision contingent on creation of deeds and filing with County, and verification by the OIO that remaining pins have been set. **SP 18-01** Brandon St. John, 4552 Holley Byron Road, tax id # 98.13-1-38.1, application for a special use permit to operate mini storage units. Planning Board did a final review of permit conditions. Planning board accepted receipt of County Planning Board review. A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the County Planning Boards recommendations as presented. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve Special Use Permit SP 18-01.

**SUPERVISOR REPORT** – Supervisor Dick Moy reported that National Grid is in the process of changing the street lights to LED bulbs.

### CORRESPONDENCE

The Greater Rochester Health Foundation sent a thank you for application to fund a Clarendon Community Farmers Market; funding has been denied.

The NYSDOT has sent notice of funding amounts to the Town Highway; CHIPS \$105,947.06; Pave NY \$24,183.47; EWR (Severe Winter Weather) \$20,219.34.

The Orleans County District Attorney has sent payment of traffic diversion proceeds for the period of January through March, 2018 in the amount of \$1164.91.

NYS Homeland Security and Emergency Services has sent the Federal Share of payment in the amount of \$13,377.61 related to the New York Severe Winter Storm declared on July 12, 2017.

Supervisor Moy read aloud congratulation from the New York State Assessors' Association to the Assessor in completing the year's assessment roll for Clarendon. Grievance Day will be on May 21, 2018.

New York State Agriculture & Markets has submitted the annual inspection reports for the Municipal Animal Shelter and the Dog Control Officer. Both were rated as Satisfactory. The itemized reports are available if anyone would like to review them.

The Orleans County Chamber of Commerce has sent a thank you for continued support and a 2018-2019 Membership Decal, which is displayed on the main door to the Town Hall. Upcoming Chamber Events were listed.

Supervisor Moy reported that NYSDOT has begun construction on a \$5.2 million paving project to rehabilitate nearly 30 miles of the Lane Ontario State Parkway between Route 19 in Hamlin and Route 237 in Kendall.


### OLD BUSINESS

The Town Board has authorized the use of a maximum of 110 accumulated sick days toward payment of Health Care coverage through a Cobra Plan at a cost of 102% of the policy cost plus a \$32.00 fee; from retirement until age 65 for Leonard Clark and Tracy Smith; to be paid for through the Highway

Unfunded Balance Account . NYS Retirement allows the option of using accumulated sick days toward retirement time in the system. Supervisor confirmed that if the days are used toward payment of medical coverage, the NYS Retirement option cannot be also chosen, even if the employee has a balance of unused sick days after using the 110 toward health care. (Options for use of the days are either Medical Insurance or Retirement System.) Dental and eye care coverage will be completely paid for by the employee after retirement.

Superintendent Swanger will attend the annual water conference June 4, 5, 6, 2018. Town Clerk and Deputy will attend tax collection conference June 11, 12, 13, 2018.

The Town Board adopted Resolutions setting Lateral Restrictions for the Water 12 and Water 13 projects in the Ag District. Proposals for Water Improvement Benefit Area No. 12 and Water District No. 13 were also accepted; as follows: Engineering Services by Chatfield Engineers, Municipal Solutions, Inc. for financial advisement and services and Attorney Karl Essler for legal services.

**NEW BUSINESS**

The Board discussed the proposed Franchise Agreement with Charter Communications; this matter was tabled to the June agenda. Supervisor has contacted Monroe County Water Authority and let them know he does not like the proposed retail lease to operate the Clarendon water districts; that he is ready to listen to a revised proposal. MCWA is proposing work that needs to be done prior to their taking over the Clarendon water and proposes the Town pay half the cost. Supervisor referenced items 3, 4 and 5 on page one: Replacement of meters in WD 2 & 3-town estimated cost \$60,000; Construction of new water main to supply WIBA10 town estimated cost \$150,000; Construction of new water main to serve WD#1 town estimated cost \$105,000. Superintendent Swanger agreed that all meters in WD 2 & 3 do not need to be replaced. WIBA 10 and WD 1 receive water from Clarendon through Village of Holley water mains. Supervisor Moy reasoned that only MCWA would benefit from new water mains; they want Holley out of the picture; No benefit to Clarendon. MCWA would take payments for proposed costs at 6% interest. Deputy Supervisor Robinson reviewed that the latest BAN renewal was at 2% interest! Supervisor Moy informed that Chatfield Engineers will meet at the Town Hall on Thursday to write up specifications to bid-out painting the water tower. The Town can obtain the \$200,000 grant if the town does it, not MCWA. Supervisor Moy referenced a report showing the fund balance for all water districts combined - \$511,347 is available to help paint the tower. MCWA estimates \$710,000 to paint the tower; Chatfield is thinking \$400,000 to \$500,000. When bids come in for the project, the town will have a firm cost. At Supervisor's request, board members agreed that he send a letter to Nick Noce at MCWA, expressing disappointment in the proposed agreement. Supervisor Moy reported a presentation about the New York Municipal Energy Program given at the Orleans County Association of Municipalities meeting regarding electric purchased at cheaper rates. Board members agreed that Supervisor Moy call and schedule a presentation at a future Town Board meeting. The Town Board held a 20 minute executive session; no formal action was taken in executive session. The Town Board adopted a Resolution authorizing retention of Legal Counsel for Judgment Enforcement and Collection.
