

Hillside Cemetery

1821-1889 Lewis Lawton

In 1874 Lewis moved his family from Pamela, Jefferson County to Clarendon. They settled on the Barre Road (now known as East Lee Road). In the book written by David Sturges Copeland "The History of Clarendon" 1810-1888, Sturges writes: On the rise in the Barre Road, to the west and north, Lewis Lawton, with his sons, Brad and Menzo, dwells with all the tools necessary, through steam power, to bring water out of the rocks at any depth. Lewis suffered from the Grip of Influenza for several weeks in December and January 1889 as reported in the Holley Standard. One article stated that he had been on the sick list but was now on the gain January 3, 1889. Unfortunately on January 27, 1889 he dies. His funeral was held at the Universalist Church in Clarendon and he was buried in Hillside Cemetery.

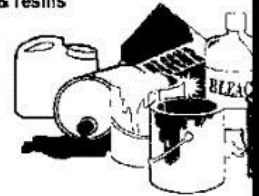

- Have quick and easy access to season dates and maps, regulations guides and important DEC contact information.

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD - Meeting Highlights July 2018

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Larry Swanger reported the paving of Munger Road has started. The second roadside mowing is in process. This month the highway crew has been helping other towns with paving and shoulder work. As always, the highway department was closed for the week of July 4th. A couple of graves were dug this month and road grindings were put in the Hillside Cemetery to enhance the road in the old section; to make it easier to drive there. Superintendent Swanger reported that the service line to the Charlie Robishaw residence on Fourth Section road was fixed; twenty days of the fixed leak showed a decrease in the water bill of \$4,000. Councilman Robinson asked consideration of having weight limits on Upper Holley Road; Superintendent will install a 'no trucks' sign.

HISTORIAN/HISTORICAL SOCIETY REPORT

Historian Melissa Ierlan submitted the following written report: The Clarendon Farmers market has been operating for three weeks; every Thursday from 3:30pm-7:00pm. Our CHS program this Wednesday is about the influenza Epidemic of 1918 by Daniel Cody. I have a student helping me prepare a new display for the barn museum. It will be two "rooms" that will be set up to look like they would have appeared in the 1890-1930's era. We have been very fortunate to have acquired several items that will help with this display. I was able to participate in the Barre Bicentennial last month. I shared my area with a woman who did chair caining, I did hand dipped candles as they may have been made by the early pioneers. It was a nice day. We have installed a new sidewalk that goes from the parking lot to the school house. We have also replaced the stairs and railing to the school house. I will be hosting twice a month on a Friday at the town hall a group interested in doing research on Clarendon. We have a small group of people who attended the first meeting July 13th.

SUPERVISOR REPORT

Supervisor Dick Moy reminded all that the August Town Board meeting will be at the Historical Society Museum Barn. Free music, hotdogs and drinks will be from 5PM to 7PM; the meeting will begin at 7PM with a public hearing regarding zoning amendments and the regular meeting to immediately follow. Supervisor Moy attended a conference near Niagara Falls hosted by USDA regarding a wide range of Rural Development grants that are available. Supervisor intends to submit applications for the Town; some grants are available to first home buyers; 1% loans are available to low income residents for

home repair. Supervisor has information from the conference available upon request. Supervisor met with the Clarendon Fire Company today. He will arrange a meeting with RDA for the Fire Co. regarding grant funds available for them. The Fire Company has sold its ambulance; residents won't see a difference in services, as Monroe Ambulance will still answer calls. The Fire Company is purchasing a new light rescue fire apparatus at a cost of \$168,000; Board members authorized Supervisor to sign an approval for borrowing.

CORRESPONDENCE

NYS Association of Towns has sent notice of seminars regarding Regional Charitable Reserve Funds in response to the Tax Cuts & Jobs Act. Engineer Michael Patterson has sent information on Global Warming. Orleans County Treasurer has sent \$1,033.50 in revenue for solid waste collection and \$89,554.25 for 2017-2018 plowing and 2018 1st mowing payment. The American Legion sent the bill for Memorial Day items in honoring our departed veterans and war dead in the cemetery. The annual cost is split with the T/Murray; \$416.71 each. Municipal Solutions has sent financing alternatives available for WIBA 12 and WD 13 projects.

OLD BUSINESS

Superintendent Swanger submitted two months of data showing water usage from Monroe County Water Authority and showing what customers are supplied by the water that flows through the Clarendon Tower. Twenty-eight percent of the water supplies the Town of Murray. Town Board in agreement to request a monetary fee of \$50,000 from the Town of Murray to help paint the Clarendon Water Tower. The Board accepted the low bid for painting the Tower from Utility Service Co., Inc. of Perry, GA at a cost of \$184,131.00. Pursuant to additional requests for work to the water system, Supervisor called Monroe County Water Authority and requested a meeting as soon as possible. Engineer John Schepp will attend. Discussion was held regarding the proposed franchise agreement from Charter Communications and board members are in agreement *not* to charge a franchise fee and to request cable be supplied to all residences in the town prior to any decision on signing the franchise agreement. The Board reviewed the annual JCAP grant funding available to the court. Paperwork for the grant needs to be submitted in October; Town Board requests detailed plans from the court for the August meeting.
