





From the Historian-



CLARENDON TOWN BOARD - Meeting Highlights August 2018



The Town Board held two public hearings prior to the regular meeting in October; one for consideration of the proposed 2019 Town Budget and one for the proposed five-year contract for fire protection and emergency services

with the Clarendon Fire Co. No comments were heard at either hearing and the board adopted both the budget and fire company contract at the regular meeting held later.

Sandra Shaw, Director of the Holley Community Free Library, informed those present that the Library, Clarendon Historical Society and Murray Historical Society have collectively worked to digitize Holley School Yearbooks from 1950 through 1989. These DVD can be purchased for \$15.00 from any one of the three entities; monies from sale will go to the organization it is purchased from. Supervisor recognized Holley students in attendance, Joel Moore and Hunter McLean.

OPEN END – County Legislator E. John DeFilipps requested town representation at the County Association of Municipalities meeting this month to give its input. There may be changes to refuse collection and cost; the contract is up and needs to be renewed. Discussion is being held that it may go to collecting every other week, with the big 96 gallon bins.

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT – Superintendent Swanger reported the Clarendon crew has been helping other towns, the Village of Holley and Orleans County with paving projects. A leak was detected by New York State when they were mowing, in a fire hydrant on Route 31A. It's been turned off and will be fixed. Water readings should be complete in a couple of days. The inside of the water tower is done and work is continuing on the outside. Water pressure

was reported low by a resident on Route 237; a Hall Road resident has not noticed a change in pressure. The new highway employee is working out well.

CORRESPONDENCE – The Orleans County Board of Elections has sent Notice of the General Election to be held Nov. 6. The Town has received payment in the amount of \$32.47 for the Falls Rail Road Pilot program. The United States Senate has sent information on the Farm to School Grant Program. The Orleans County Farm Bureau Annual Meeting will be October 11, 201 8 at Tillman's Village Inn in Gaines. New York State Comptroller has sent State Aid in the amount of \$11,416.00. We have received the 2017 Annual Report for Monroe County Water Authority.

OLD BUSINESS - Supervisor still has had no response from the Town of Murray regarding help in painting the water tower; he will write a letter. The Board approved moving forward with the consolidation of water district 9 and 9 extension and authorized Municipal Solutions to begin the process. There has been no call back from Charter Communications regarding the franchise agreement and Supervisor reported a meeting is scheduled with Monroe County Water Authority for October 26.

NEW BUSINESS - Resolutions were adopted for both new water projects WIBA 12 and WD 13; Final Orders, Bond Counsel, Legal Services and Loan agreement with Rural Development; WIBA 12 grant of \$740,000 and loan of \$510,000; WD 13 grant of \$790,000 and loan of \$450,000. The Board adopted a Resolution scheduling a special meeting on Nov. 1 to authorize unpaid mowing and water charges to be put on the January 2019 town/county tax bills and the Board adopted a Conflict of Interest Policy.
