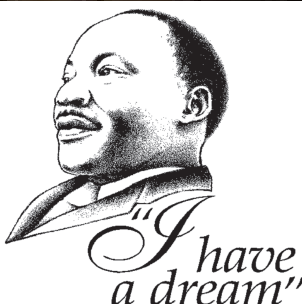

Hillside Cemetery

Christmas holiday season is a time when many of us are remembering our loved ones who have passed away. There is a natural inclination to want to remember loved ones during this religious time of year, but for many it's not just about remembering it's about connecting. It's about involving our late loved ones in our holiday celebration. Many will go to visit cemeteries and graves during the holidays, but many more want to expand the celebration by decorating the graves.

The tradition of flowers being placed on graves is over 2,000 years old. This custom can be traced to the ancient Greeks. The tradition began in America at the end of the Civil War. Searching for some way to express their grief, countless Americans gravitated to bouquets of flowers.

Symbolic Meanings of Plants and Flowers for Christmas:

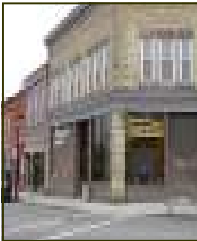
Holly - The prickly leaves represent the crown of thorns that Jesus wore when he was crucified. The berries are the drops of blood that were shed by Jesus because of the thorns.

Wreath - The wreath has significant meaning for the season. Its circular shape represents eternity, for it has no beginning and no end. From a Christian religious perspective, it represents an unending circle of life. The evergreen, most frequently used in making wreaths, symbolizes growth and everlasting life.

Poinsettia - The shape of the poinsettia flower and leaves are sometimes thought as a symbol of the Star of Bethlehem which led the Wise Men to Jesus. The red colored leaves symbolize the blood of Christ. The white leaves represent his purity.

As one drives by the Hillside Cemetery in Clarendon this season, they will see many graves that are adorned with wreaths and lights. Some have miniature Christmas trees and ornaments. It is very important for some to do this not only at Christmas time but all through the year. While it is very personal it is also there for many to see and perhaps it brings a sense of comfort to individuals who are missing their loved ones not only on the holidays but "every day".

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD - Meeting Highlights December 2018



HIGHWAY DEPT REPORT

Superintendent Swanger reported salting and plowing this month. The crew has been filling holes on Wood Road with crusher run. The water tower was back on line on the 21st and the hydrants have been flushed. All seems well with the water system.

The Town has received proposals from Triple-O and Frontier Heat for maintenance services. Councilman Major will obtain a third proposal from the company used by the Fire Company - Issaac Heating. The Town has received \$59,720.07 from the State DOT for snow & ice services. Orleans County Planning Board 2018 Attendance has been received. Clarendon Representative, Kevin Johnson has 100% attendance record.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Griggs submitted the Planning Board meeting calendar for the year 2019 and the following written report: **11-27-2018 (Regular meeting)** - Meeting cancelled due to insufficient agenda items. **12-11-2018 (Regular Meeting)** - 2019 Planning Board Calendar - A motion was made, seconded, and approved to adopt the 2019 Planning Board calendar. 2019 Planning Board recommendations for appointment - A motion was made, seconded, and approved to recommend the following appointments to the Town for their consideration and approval: Patrick White, Planning Board Member, Five (5) year term to expire 12-31-23; Karen Bradshaw, Planning Board Alternate, One (1) year term to expire 12-31-2019; David R. Griggs, Planning Board Chairman, one (1) year term to expire 12-31-2019; Kevin Johnson, Planning Board Deputy Chairman, one (1) year term to expire 12-31-2019.

CORRESPONDENCE

Orleans County Legislature sent notice of Mortgage Tax Receipts between April 1 through September 30, 2018; Clarendon received \$15,923.51. The Town received \$363.27 from NYMIR insurance; Clarendon's portion of reciprocal's current surplus. Notice has been received of scheduled public hearings to consider Plans in connection with NY broadband program phase 3 Hughes Network Systems, LLC Projects. These projects touch 56 counties throughout New York State, including Orleans County.

OLD BUSINESS

Supervisor Moy reviewed that if Monroe County Water Authority had taken over the water system three years ago, they would have spent \$700,000 to paint the water tank to their specifications. Clarendon has paid for the painting. MCWA wants Clarendon to replace meters in WD 2 and 3 and has requested additional items. Supervisor has called multiple times and has had no response from MCWA. Board members discussed the pros and cons for keeping and/or giving the water system to MCWA. Past meeting minutes were referenced. The Town Board held a roll-call vote to give the water system over to Monroe County Water Authority. The vote was three to two to keep the water system in Clarendon's control. Patrick White was reappointed to a five year seat on the Planning Board; term to expire 12/31/2023. The Board adopted a Resolution accepting Councilmen Robinson and Major's affirmation of highway equipment audit. The Board agreed to receive special council services from Attorney John Sansone on an as needed basis and adopted a Resolution to extend the snow & ice agreement with New York State for 2019/2020. Resolutions were adopted accepting the proposal from LaBella Associates for consultant services for WIBA 12 and WD 13.
