## Hillside Cemetery

**Ryerson Sharpe** was born in Ontario Canada April 19, 1841. Ryerson Sharpe age 23, enlisted September 1, 1864 at

Mexico to serve one year, mustered in as private Company D 184<sup>th</sup> Regiment NYSV Infantry on September 12, 1864 and promoted to corporal. He mustered out on June 29, 1865 at City Point, VA. He located to Orleans County after the war and was a resident for some 60 years.

On May 16, 1912 the Holley W.C.T.U (Women's Christian Temperance Union) decided to honor the dead civil war soldiers from the area on Memorial Day. In an article from the Holley Standard it was noted that only eight soldiers were still alive in the village and they would be honored. The same article listed the names of 50 soldiers from the civil war that were buried in Hillside and Holy Cross Cemetery.



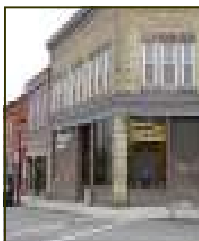
Ryerson passed away at the age of 87 due to failing health. His obituary noted that he was affiliated with the Holley Lodge, No. 42, I.O.O.F. (Independent Order of Odd Fellows) and had been a past Noble Grand. His wife Ella M. Sharpe died in 1940 at the age of 87 was also a past Noble Grand of the Charity Rebekah Lodge of Holley (the female auxiliary of the I.O.O.F)

If you are in the Holley Village Square and look at the row of buildings on the Northeast side you can see the building with the I.O.O.F marking at the very top. This was the former Holley Lodge No. 42.

*The Clarendon Historian received a desk that once belonged to the Copeland family, specifically George M. Copeland who was the second owner of the Old Stone Store. This desk was donated in memory of Dudley and Margaret Mathes, loyal longtime residents. On the desk sits an adding machine that was donated by the family of Wes Potter whose grandfather David Symonds and mother Olive Potter owned the stone store. Wes was the last owner in his family and this was in his possession after he sold the store.*

## CLARENDON TOWN BOARD - Meeting Highlights January 2019

### OPEN END

County Legislator E. John DeFilipps informed the Board that all court arraignments off hours will be done at the county court in Albion. A public defender and/or district attorney need to be present. This is a state mandate. New York State will pay the justices but not the court clerks. ADA Joanne Best will discuss the matter at the County Association of Municipalities meeting next week. This will affect the Municipalities; funding for clerks needs to be figured out. Legislator DeFilipps also informed that the Federal Primary Election is proposed to being on June 26; Petitions can be carried beginning February 26. Legislator urged that anyone wanting to run for elected office should soon submit their letter requesting party support.

### HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Larry Swanger reported receipt of the new excavator a couple of weeks ago. The crew has been plowing and salting and helped move items from the town hall to the stone store. Water meters have been read and 2018 4<sup>th</sup> quarter bills are going out in the mail.

There was **NO PLANNING BOARD REPORT** due to cancelled meetings.

### HISTORIAN/CHS REPORT

Supervisor Moy reported that Historian Melissa Ierlan is organizing the historical items in the stone store. The Historical Society has secured its program speakers for 2019.

There was **NO SUPERVISOR REPORT**.

### CORRESPONDENCE

The Orleans County Legislature sent notice of 2019 sales tax apportionments to towns and villages; Clarendon will receive \$116,260.89.

Monroe County Water Authority has sent notice of a water rate increase from \$2.43 to \$2.54 per 1000 gallons and an increase from \$5.25 to \$5.49 base charge per day per meter size. A check in the amount of \$350.00 was sent from the County Treasurer for the 2018 Stop DWI Annual Plan. The Association of Towns has sent information and registration forms for the annual training session for town officials held in New York City; it is Feb 17-20, 2019. Superintendent Swanger salvaged highway scrap and received a check in the amount of \$178.90 from David Dunn Salvage, Inc. Orleans County Planning Board has sent its 2019 meeting schedule. A check was received from the NYSDOT in the amount of \$132,149.87 for CHIPS, PAVENY & WIRP payments.

### OLD BUSINESS

Councilman Major reported waiting for a call back from Issaac Heating & Cooling to obtain a quote for cleaning the town hall furnaces.

### NEW BUSINESS

The Town Board handled its organizational items, pay rate designations and annual appointments. Resolutions were adopted; as follows: Authorizing payments of bill in advance of audit; Designating the town's maximum monthly contribution for medical insurance benefits; Accepting the contract for CEO Services; Faithful performance of governmental officials, designating the town's maximum monthly contribution for dental insurance benefits, reaffirming the board's support of the 2<sup>nd</sup> amendment and approving application to NYS Department of audit & control for approval of establishment of WIBA 12. Jim Sheffer was reappointed and Ann Winkley was appointed; each to a five year seat on the Zoning Board. The Town Board authorized water rate increases pursuant to the increase to the Town. Rates with Village of Holley as supplier will increase twenty cents per thousand gallons from \$5.40 to \$5.60. Rates with MCWA as supplier will increase fifteen cents per thousand gallons from \$3.75 to \$3.90.
