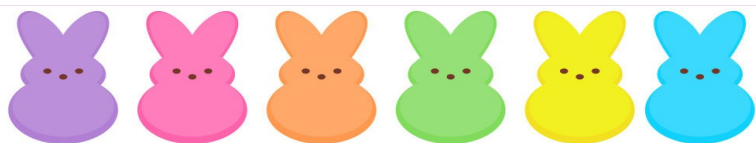

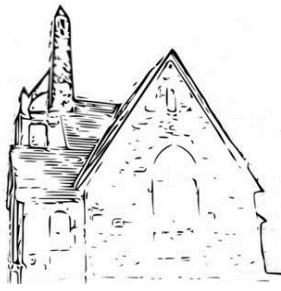

Frank Sheffield
1876-1960



Frank was the son of George Sheffield who was a grocer listed in the 1892 census. Frank went into the family business and his son Harold joined him for a period of

time. Harold died "suddenly" in 1942 and the newspapers reported that he was due to report for the next draft under the selective service. Sheffield Grocery ran in Albion as well as the Village of Holley.

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD - Meeting Highlights March 2019

TOWN HALL MEETING

Prior to the Town Board Meeting in March, Barre Residents John Metzler and Kerri Richardson spoke in opposition of the Town of Bare Wind Project proposed by Heritage Wind LLC, a subsidiary of Apex Clean Energy, Inc. Kerri Richardson heads up a group of over 100 residents called 'Clear Skies above Barre'. The project is proposing thirty-three turbines at 680 feet tall. Six will be within one half mile of the Clarendon town line and will be very visible from many towns. These turbines will be two to three hundred feet taller than the ones in Wyoming. Mr. Metzler left handouts for those present. Mr. Metzner informed that no geological study or SEQR has been done.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Larry Swanger reported plowing the past month and that more salt has been used this year than over the last thirty years. The crew has been filling pot-holes when weather allows and has been picking up downed limbs. Six hundred Superintendents in the state travelled to Albany asking for \$150 million more in CHIPS aid and to restore extreme weather money that the Governor wants to remove. The Town Board approved purchase of a John Deere zero turn mower for use in Hillside Cemetery with trade in of the old mower at a final cost of \$3054.40. Also approved was the purchase of a Kubota rotary broom from Bentley Brothers at a cost of \$6695. The Board approved a wage increase for the seasonal cemetery worker from \$12/hour to \$14/hour.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman David Griggs submitted the following written report: 02-26-2019 (Regular meeting) Meeting cancelled due to insufficient agenda items. 03-12-2019 (Regular Meeting) SP 05-03, Special Permit Renewal, Verizon Wireless Tower (American Tower), 16640 Munger Road. Site has been inspected, fee paid, no outstanding complaints. A Motion was made to renew, seconded, and approved. SP 96-005, Special Permit Renewal, Pets Galore, Nancy Curtis-Caswell 4880 S. Holley Rd. Site has been inspected, fee paid, no outstanding complaints. A Motion was made to renew, seconded, and approved. Preliminary discussion regarding potential Zoning changes relevant to Commercial applications of Alternative Energy Systems (Wind, Solar).

SUPERVISOR REPORT

Supervisor Moy reported that a sign for each pioneer cemetery has been ordered by Historian Ierlan. The Robinson Cemetery sign was on display in the boardroom. Historian items are being arranged in the Stone Store.

CORRESPONDENCE

Orleans County Personnel & Self Insurance has sent the schedule of Awareness Training to be attended by town employees. Environmental Design & Research Engineering Co., representing the Heritage Wind Project, has sent a request for information regarding identification of visually sensitive resources that may affect their project.

OLD BUSINESS

Discussion was held regarding the proposed zoning changes and the International Property Code that has been adopted by New York State as its code; The State recommends that municipalities adopt it. The International Code is very specific in every area.

NEW BUSINESS

Proposal was accepted from Dan Jones to maintain the Glidden Road Cemetery for the 2019 season. The Town Board adopted three Resolutions; Urging NYS to fund costs for voting reforms at the county level; Opposing proposed and amended state cost shifts to the county and Opposing assembly bill prohibiting firearms prizes in games of chance. The Board accepted a proposal from Williamson Law for computer software and Amato Fox & Co., PC have been secured as Auditor for the Town's Audit mandated by Rural Development pursuant to federal funding for water projects 12 and 13.
