# CLARENDON TOWN BOARD

## Meeting Highlights Summary

### January 2020

#### HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Tracy Chalker reported that the highway crew has been plowing and salting; the Town is using a lot of salt as the weather turns from rain to snow to rain, etc... The salt has been treated with Ice Ban. The crew did some work repairing potholes with cold patch and repaired the pickup truck. The crew helped the County with tree removal on South Holley road and did a temporary clean-up in Hillside Cemetery. Ninety percent of the town's salt quota will be received after delivery of the current order. Water readings have been done; Ti-Sales has been contacted regarding problems with meter readings. All highway employees will attend school to obtain a Grade "D" water license. Superintendent Chalker will continue the education to upgrade to a "C" license. Superintendent Chalker would like a video camera to photograph all the small tools and equipment at the garage to be included with the Highway Equipment Audit. Superintendent Chalker presented a request from one of the highway employees to be credited for the eight years worked as a part-time employee. Part-time hours worked totaled 3999; Supervisor Moy reported that the county gives part time employees one year time credited for every 2088 hours worked. The Town Board determined this employee will receive two years full-time credit based on his part-time hours. Superintendent Chalker also requested permission to use comp time for employees instead of over-time pay; to be used during slow times in the year. Supervisor Moy will look into the request and get back to Mr. Chalker.

#### PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Dave Griggs submitted the following written report: **12/24/2019 Regular Meeting** was cancelled due to the holiday. **01/14/2020 Regular Meeting.** **SP94-005** Special Permit Renewal, Dianne Hilabush, 4229 S. Fancher Rd., Dianne's Hair Boutique. Fee Paid; Inspected; No outstanding complaints. Motion was made, seconded and approved to approve renewal. **SP91-016** Keith Diehl, New Guinea Rd. Aggregate Placement, Inc. (Formerly Roy Kenyon Hard Times Gravel Pit). Fee Paid; Inspected; No outstanding complaints. Motion was made, seconded and approved to approve renewal.

#### CORRESPONDENCE

An abstract of monies paid by Orleans County to Clarendon in 2019 was received. The Town of Sweden sent draft amendments to its town code regarding telecommunication facilities. Notice of annual training school and meeting was sent by the Association of Towns. Monroe County Water Authority sent Notice of Water Rate Change. Notice was received regarding the need for the annual town board audit of court records. Orleans County Legislature's resolution approving apportionment of 2020 sales tax to towns and villages was received. Clarendon will receive \$116,260.89.

#### OLD BUSINESS

The Town Board approved amending the Clarendon Water District Rules & Regulations, listing specific procedure to be taken for non-payment of water bills.

#### NEW BUSINESS

The Town Board awarded the construction bid for Water District No. 13 to Keeler Construction. The Board determined that the town properties will be mowed by the highway department personnel in 2020; on a trial basis. The Board determined that the annual August hot dog and music celebration at the Historical Society will again be held this year. A Resolution was adopted accepting the affirmation of the highway equipment audit. A workshop meeting regarding solar in the town zoning was scheduled for February 27, 2020 at 6:00 PM and the Board signed into a legal services agreement for 2020 with Attorney John Sansone.



**George Henry  
Copeland**

was a descendant of two of the pioneer families of Clarendon. His father George Morey Copeland was born in Massachusetts and arrived here with his parents. Laura Sturges was the daughter of David Sturges who came to Clarendon in 1815. Sturges built the Old Stone Store in 1836 and when he died his son in law took over the business. George Henry was one of twelve children that George M and Laura had. He was born on March 17, 1846. David Sturges Copeland was his older brother and the author of the very important book, The History of Clarendon 1810-1889. In 1876 George entered into partnership with his father who had succeeded David Sturges. George ran that general store for forty years and retired in 1916. He married Miss Etta Darrow on June 12, 1878, also from Clarendon. George was the leader of the M.E. Church choir in the 1880's. His wife was the secretary for the Maplewood Cemetery in Clarendon in 1914. In his obituary July 16, 1928 he is survived by his wife Etta (Etta died March 2, 1930). They had no children and both were survived by siblings and many nieces and nephews.
