CLARENDON RESIDENTS HOOKED INTO THE PUBLIC WATER SYSTEM **TAKE NOTICE** that at the January meeting of the Town Board, the following text was added to the Rules & Regulations under Section 22: Discontinuance of Service: For nonpayment of charges; as follows: Two weeks following the 30 days allowed to pay a water bill, anyone in arrears will receive a letter

stating the following: "Your water bill has not been paid. Your new total bill, including a 10% penalty is \$____. You have 20 days to pay your water bill or your water service will be terminated. If you are on cash payment Socials Services, please contact the billing clerk at (585) 638-6371 or email at waterclerk@townofclarendon.org." Five days before the water is scheduled for shut-off, a red tag will be placed on the residence as a reminder that payment is due in 5 days or the water will be shut-off. Residents will receive additional charges for the turn-off and turn-on of their water service according to the Town of Clarendon Fee Schedule as determined by Town Board Resolution and may be amended from time to time in the sole discretion of the Board. When the town water service is terminated as above, the Code Enforcement Officer will be notified of the termination of the potable water supply. Whenever any water service is terminated for a period of 24 hours, the Certificate of Occupancy shall be Notice Continued on Page 5

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD Meeting Highlights Summary February 2020

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Chalker reported that the crew has done a lot of plowing and salting this past month, a lot of it happening on the weekends. Some trees and brush hanging over the roads has been trimmed. Superintendent informed that the salt is still being mixed with ice ban, which seems to help keep it on the roads. The brush pile behind the Highway Garage has been burned and trucks have required maintenance this past month. Superintendent Chalker reported that a video was made of all the small items at the Highway Garage; it's been given to Melissa to transfer and house the file for safe keeping. A representative from Ti-Sales software used with the water meter reading gun, will provide additional training at the Town Hall for the billing clerk and some of the highway crew that takes the meter readings on Wednesday. Superintendent Chalker referenced the shared services agreement proposed by New York State to share services, exchange or lend materials or equipment to assist the maintenance of State and Municipal roads and highways; in the past, any agreement for shared services pertained to a 'one-time-use' job and felt it should continue as such; not to sign into the agreement received

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Dave Griggs submitted the following written report: 1/28/2020 Regular meeting was cancelled due to insufficient agenda items. 2/11/2020 Regular Meeting; BP#02-01 – Hanson Aggregates, Holley Byron Road, Tax ID 98.-1-57. Fee paid, Mining Permit on file, current insurance certificate on file, updated blaster's license on file, inspected. No outstanding complaints. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve renewal.

HISTORIAN REPORT

Historian/CHS President Melissa Ierlan submitted the following written report: I have been contacted by two students at GCC asking for community service work and will likely utilize them to continue organizing at the Stone Store. Have spent time with Matt Ballard the County Historian this month looking through his collections for new fun facts. I am hoping to help him unpack when he moves to his new space soon. I have had some very amazing people help me to put a very broken historical marker back together and it is almost done being painted. I branched out to Genesee County again for this one. I was involved this past Sunday at Disciples United Methodist Church for Scout Sunday. There will be an article in the March Gazette. I am also assisting the Disciples United Methodist Church in having their 1939 stained glass windows evaluated and looking for grant money to stabilize them. We continue to have the Clarendon research group a couple times a month here at the town hall. Things should start picking up around here soon when the weather breaks! Supervisor Moy suggested that the next time someone approaches the town for community service time, they be sent to the highway department to paint water hydrants; Superintendent Chalker in agreement.

SUPERVISOR REPORT

Supervisor Dick Moy reported that the town ran under budget last year. On February 20, 2020 at 11:00 AM there will be another tour of the old high school in the Village; sign up at the American Legion.

CORRESPONDENCE

The Town of Sweden has sent Notice of a Public Hearing for amendments to its Comprehensive Plan. NYMIR (our insurance carrier) has sent recommendations for the Town as follow-up to the building inspections done earlier this month. Clarendon has received \$533.33 in proceeds for the fourth quarter 2019 Traffic Diversion Program. Farmer to Neighbor Night sponsored by the Orleans County Cornell Cooperative Extension, Farm Bureau, Soil & Water, Chamber of Commerce and Albion FFA Alumni will be held on March 14, 2020 at the White Birch in Lyndonville.

OLD BUSINESS

The Town Board adopted a Resolution accepting an agreement for payment of municipal engineering from Oriden LLC for outside review of an ordinance for solar in Clarendon.

NEW BUSINESS

The Town Board increased water rates for those supplied by Monroe County Water Authority by twentyfive cents per thousand gallons. The Town's Comprehensive Plan is due for its ten year update; a committee needs to be formed. Councilman Marc Major volunteered to work on this committee. Planning Chairman Griggs will ask Planning Board members for volunteers. Last update included interested citizens on the committee also. Superintendent Chalker presented his proposed expenditures of highway monies for 2020; as follows: 1) LaDue Road – Cold in place recycle 1.55 miles with 20 ft. travel width and 3 inches in depth (Between South Holley Road and Monroe County


Híllsíde Cemetery




Guy served as the town clerk for many years in Clarendon in addition to being a farmer. The original farm, although somewhat smaller, still belongs to a member of the Bowen family today.





line). Replacing 1-12 inch culvert pipe; 1st pipe from east end. Chip Sealing after it cures out. Shoulder replacement at 1.55 miles 2 ft. wide both sides. Estimated total cost of \$174,080.77. 2) Church Street - Chip Seal full length .36 miles with 20 ft. travel width (Between NYS Route 237 and NYS Route 31A). Estimated total cost of \$8,480.00. 3) Bennetts Corners Road center section Chip Seal .63 miles with 20 ft. travel width (Between NYS Route 31A and Taylor Road). Estimated total cost of \$16,000.00. 4) Bennetts Corners Road north section -Repair pot holes in center and rebuild shoulders of drive lanes as needed. Chip Seal full length (Between Taylor Road and Murray town line). Estimated total cost of \$21,248.96. The Town Board signed the proposed expenditures of highway moneys budgeted. The Town Board adopted a Resolution accepting the affirmation signed by Supervisor Moy and Councilman Robinson for the audit of 2019 Justice Court Records. Supervisor has spoken with Nick Penna and requested a proposal to renew the Town's lease agreement with him to farm the Hillside Cemetery Property: It will expire in April.
