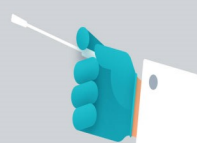

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD Meeting Highlights - DECEMBER 2021

Orleans County District Attorney Joe Cardone presented information about a study being done for alternatives to the current court system. The NYS constitution called for two elected justices per town. That was changed in the early 2000s; courts on the west end have consolidated and other courts have reduced to one judge in its town. In 1992 the county had 25 town and village justices. Now there are 12 or 13 due to elimination of village courts and justices in town courts. The alternative system being looked at is called a District Court; one or two in the county. District Court would require full time judges elected to a 6-year term and clerical staff. The state requires judges in a district court to be attorneys. If the town wants to look at it, there would be a public hearing and information would be more detailed; this would need a majority vote at the general election by the residents. There needs to be two or more towns in favor in order to have a District Court. Councilman Paul R. Nicosia was thanked for his 33 years of service to the Town of Clarendon. Paul did not run for re-election in November; he is retiring from serving the Community Government. *(See page 7 of this gazette).*

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Tracy Chalker reported being busy plowing and salting the roads and trimming trees. Seems any wind over 20 mph brings trees down and it kept the crew busy over last weekend; trees are taking wires down and are well out of the right of way. The county is trimming their roads and helping the town. Trees came down at Hillside Cemetery. There was one burial this past month and Wood Road was graded. Beavers have been creating an issue with drainage on Wood Road; three beavers have been caught by the Highway Department. Christmas decorations have been put up. Legislators Ken DeRoller and John DeFilipps were thanked for disposing of the town's old tires, saving us approximately \$5,000.

Motion made, seconded and approved to declare this a minor subdivision for SEQRA purpose. Motion made seconded and approved to approve application contingent upon merger of property with existing Ladd parcel, setting of survey pins, filing with county. SD 21-12, Pre-conference for a two (2) lot subdivision, Lisa Fiorito, tax id# 99.-1-47.11. Survey map provided; no issues noted with proposal. Applicant requested waiver. Motion made, seconded and approved to waive pre-conference and move to formal. Motion made, seconded and approved to declare this a minor subdivision for SEQRA purpose.

Motion made seconded and approved to approve application contingent upon creation of deeds and filing with county. SP 21-07, Dustin Pahman, 16213 East Lee Road, tax id# 98.-1-2, boarding/riding lessons. The County Planning Board failed to act on this application within the designated time frame. Motion made, seconded, and approved to approve Special Use Permit.

SUPERVISOR REPORT

Supervisor asked Councilmen to think it over as to whether or not to have a district court. Supervisor reported that Councilman Marc Major is the new Fire Chief of the Clarendon Fire Company.

CORRESPONDENCE

The NYS Public Service Commission has sent an update on the Solar Electric Generating Facility in the Town of Byron. The Town of Murray has sent notice of public hearings regarding its Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance. Orleans County has sent notice and payment of Mortgage Tax Distribution for the period of April 1 through September 30, 2021; Clarendon has received \$25,412.02. Orleans County has paid the town \$100 for 2021 DWI Convictions. AIM state aid has been received in the amount of \$11,416.00.

NEW BUSINESS

The Town Board accepted the County agreement for Control of Snow/Ice at \$6,239.54 per mile and Mowing of County Roads at \$655.97 per mile for the 2022 season. Agreement to expire 12/31/2026. The bid from Arnold's Tree Service for removal of dead tree in Hillside Cemetery was accepted at \$3500. 2021/2022 Municipal Snow & Ice Agreement with the State was accepted; 2021 -\$86,931.51; 2022 - \$101,229.32. Superintendent Chalker was given permission to accept a bid price for the old town hall 1000-gallon fuel tank at \$3150; sold through Auctions International.

The Town Board held its Organizational Meeting for the new year on January 3, 2022. Annual Designations and Appointments were made; Supervisor Richard Moy was re-appointed as Marriage Officer for a two-year term; health benefits payment ceiling was adopted; contract for CEO services and agreement for Legal Services were accepted; faithful performance of governmental officials and bonding was adopted. The water maintenance agreement with the Village of Holley will be discussed at the regular meeting held on January 18, 2022.
