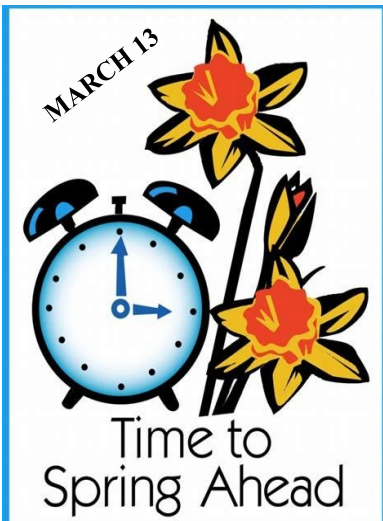

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD Meeting Highlights - FEBRUARY 2021

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT –

Superintendent Tracy Chalker reported that the highway crew has been plowing and salting. Work has been done with the county on tree clean-up. The rear-end of the 403 truck went out to be fixed. Many mailboxes have been taken down because of the snow. Tracy Smith has started as part-time MEO. Water meters ordered with ARPA funds have been received. The highway crew will work on installing these. Superintendent Chalker reported that in January 2021, the trucks went out on 19 runs and cost of fuel was at \$1.574/gallon. In January 2022, trucks have made 31 runs with cost of fuel at \$2.99/gallon. The CHIPS rally in Albany has been cancelled due to COVID. The town board gave approval for purchase of hot water pressure washer. Superintendent Chalker completed his final water assessment on February 8 and is just waiting for the official license to come in the mail from the state. This could take up to three months.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT -

Chairman Dave Griggs submitted the following written report: 01-25-2022 (Public Hearing) Chairman Griggs opened a public hearing regarding a Special Use permit application, SP 22-01, Automotive repair shop, All American Diesel, Erich Hoak, 5267 County Line Road, tax id# 99.-2-5.1. Hearing attendees were asked three times if anyone wished to speak for or against this application. Several people spoke in favor of the application, no one spoke against it. Chairman Griggs closed the public hearing. 01-25-2022 (Regular Meeting) SD 22-01, Pre-conference for building lot approval for a single-family home and a 40' x 60' accessory structure, tax id#99.-2-5.1, Tom DiFante, 4641 County Line Road. Site comprises 9.59 acres and is located in proposed water improvement district 14. Applicant was apprised that the water district has not been finalized and depending upon build schedule that a well may be required. No other issues were noted with the proposal per the submitted sketch plan. Applicant requested a waiver from the pre-conference. Motion was made, seconded and approved to waive the pre-conference and move to formal application.

A motion was made, seconded and approved the site plan as presented. SP 22-01, Automotive repair shop, All American Diesel, Erich Hoak, 5267 County Line Road, tax id# 99.-2-5.1, Planning Board Members reviewed the Special Permit conditions with the applicant (Parking, hours of operation, waste removal, buffering, lighting, signage, etc.) and reviewed the SEQRA. No issues. A motion was made, seconded and approved to make a negative declaration for SEQRA. A motion was made, seconded and approved to submit this application to the County Planning Board for their review and comment. 02-08-2022 (Regular Meeting) Meeting canceled due to insufficient agenda items

CORRESPONDENCE

NYS DOT has sent payment of \$67,000 for its Snow & Ice Contract with the Town. Orleans County has sent notice of 2022 sales tax apportionments to the towns and villages; Clarendon will receive \$116,260.89.

OLD BUSINESS

The Town Board scheduled a public hearing to consider proposed amendments for the town zoning ordinance. *See Notice on page 4 of this Gazette.*

NEW BUSINESS

The Town Board accepted the proposal to maintain the town hall gardens in 2022 from Beth Skehan at \$700 for the season. The board rescinded the motion adopted at the 12/3/21 meeting regarding COVID mask protocol at the town hall. Governor Hochul has done away with the mandate; masks are not required in the town hall. Marc Major was appointed as second deputy supervisor and the board affirmed the local court audit performed by Supervisor Moy and Councilman Caufield, as required by New York State.

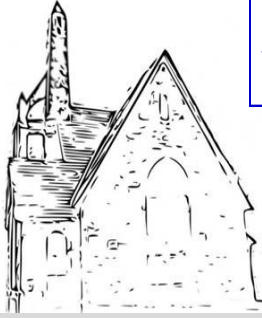

BE ADVISED that the Clarendon Town Board will hold a public hearing on March 15, 2022 at 6:30 PM to consider proposed amendments to the town zoning ordinance. Sections in Article VI to be amended include Section 636 - Trailer, Travel/Camper/Recreational Vehicle, specifically allowing them to be located on private lots allowing flexibility to land owner for 'special occasions'; and Section 650 - Non-Conforming Uses, Lots and Structures, identifying areas needing clarification or revision to keep language consistent and unambiguous. A copy of said proposed amendments is available at the Clerk's Office upon request or on the web at townofclarendon.org on the Planning/Zoning Department page. A link to the proposed amendments is also on the Legal Notice page Those interested in speaking in favor of or in opposition to the proposed amendments will be heard at this hearing. **ALSO BE ADVISED** that the regular monthly meeting of the Clarendon Town Board will begin immediately upon close of the public hearing.

Josiah Lawton was born on September 7, 1826 in Herkimer NY. He moved to Clarendon sometime after 1840 with his family. Josiah married Nancy A. Burns of Montgomery County and together they had 2 children. Son Ruegene Elias and daughter Sarah Emmojene. Josiah was a blacksmith

by trade and a farmer. He owned a farm on Hindsburg Road in Clarendon. Josiah registered for the draft during the Civil War but records show that he had a defective eye, it is assumed that he was excused from service.

A newspaper article published in the Democrat & Chronicle on March 11, 1896 described the election in the Town of Clarendon being closely contested which resulted in a sweeping victory for the Republicans. It further stated that for a number of years the town had been strongly

Democratic but had come in line as one of the banner Republican towns of Orleans County. Josiah was elected as the town justice. He served as town justice for many years and had in fact won a four-year term just before his death.

Josiah was a member of the Local Independent Order of Odd Fellows Holley Lodge, No. 42 and was honored along with 50 other deceased members on the Odd Fellows Memorial Day June 15, 1902.

Interestingly enough, the settlement of Manning was west of Clarendon and had been known by other names such as West Clarendon, Mudville and Lawton's Corner!

DEC Accepting Applications for Day-Old Pheasant Chick Program

For over 100 years DEC has worked with hunters, conservation groups, 4-H groups, and other cooperators to raise and release ring-necked pheasants to increase public hunting opportunities. DEC's [Reynolds Game Farm](#) distributes over 30,000 day-old chicks to cooperators each year. Day-old pheasant chicks are available at no cost to participants who are able to provide a brooding facility, a covered outdoor rearing pen, and an adequate release site. Approved applicants will receive the day-old chicks in April, May, or June. No chicks obtained through the Day-Old Pheasant Chick Program can be released on private shooting preserves, and all release sites must be approved in advance by DEC and must be open for public pheasant hunting opportunities. The program is funded through the State Conservation Fund from license fees paid by hunters, trappers, and anglers.

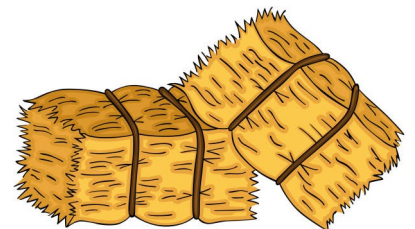
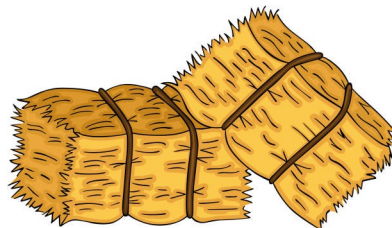
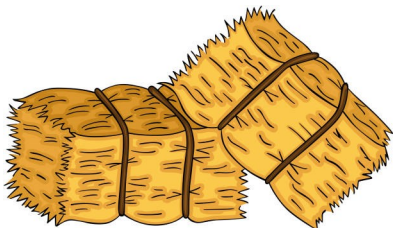
