# CLARENDON TOWN BOARD

## Meeting Highlights - June 2022

### HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Tracy Chalker reported attending highway school in Ithaca, NY; that it was very informative. The crew has been working with the towns of Shelby and Barre on paving; in their towns and in Clarendon. The first roadside mowing is 90% complete; town properties continue to be mowed and water meters are still being changed out. Fifty-seven tags were hung this past quarter for non-payment of water bills. Two services were turned off. Supervisor Moy commented that now when we reach the step of hanging tags, we're looking at unpaid bills of \$3,000; that it used to be somewhere around \$30,000. Superintendent Chalker reported that the highway department cost alone for the process of hanging the tags is in excess of \$471.50 per quarter. This doesn't include the clerk work at the town hall. Trees are being cleaned up when needed; three deer were removed from roadsides and there were three burials at Hillside this past month. Superintendent Chalker requested town board authorization to purchase a camera system for use at the highway garage and referenced the bid received from Direct Security Systems in January. Superintendent will request an update of the \$4999.00 quote, to include an upgrade for three cameras at \$100 each. The Board did authorize the purchase an Hik Vision IP Surveillance Video System including three camera upgrades from Direct Security Systems, 521 Cornwall Ave., Buffalo, NY 14215 at a cost not to exceed \$6000. Town Clerk addressed the board regarding water services that have been turned off or for properties that are vacant or red-tagged that are still getting charged the \$18.90 quarterly maintenance fee; that goes unpaid and penalties are added – each quarterly billing. The account balance is levied onto the tax bill and the charges begin again. Superintendent Chalker reported that in the Village of Holley, if a property has a meter, they get the charge. Inconsistencies were reported; Supervisor wants to look at those records.

### PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Dave Griggs reported that MRB Engineering has blocked off time for their review this week of the solar project before the Planning Board. Chairman Griggs made calls to other towns and Soil and Water about soil testing of the project; Ogden responded that things being looked for are arsenic, lead, zinc, etc. The next Planning Board is cancelled because of the Primary Elections. The following written report was submitted: 05-24-2022 (Regular Meeting) - SP 22-10, Saturn Power Project - South Holley Rd. (pre-conference) Chairman Griggs invites Saturn Power representative Jared Perram to explain the project to the planning Board regarding their proposed 19.99 MW Solar project at 5122 S. Holley Rd. Jared states that drawings, supportive data & environmental studies have been submitted to the Planning Board for review. Chairman Griggs responded that the planning Board will be submitting that data to the town engineer (MRB) for review and reinforced to the applicant that they were responsible for any cost associated with that review. He also pointed out that no review would commence until the application was completed and the fee paid. Numerous questions were posed (weight impact on roads, traffic volume, suppliers, project output, number of modules, inverters, expected lifespan of equipment, adjacent muck lands, etc.). Chairman Griggs states that the planning board will act as lead agency for SEQRA. Chairman Griggs points out that this is just the beginning of the process and as the project review progresses there will be a public hearing and submission to the County Planning Board for their review. This item will be carried on the next agenda as continuing business. 06-14-2022 (Regular Meeting) - SP 22-10, Saturn Power Project pre-conference for Special Use Permit for Commercial Solar, 5122 - South Holley Rd.

The Planning Board addressed several questions at open end regarding procedures for review and impact on existing Zoning. Chairman Griggs informs the board that the application fee has now been paid but that our engineering firm (MRB) has not yet begun the process of reviewing the project data yet. MRB Group will be reviewing the documents submitted to see if the proposed project fits the requirements dictated by Article VII, Section 730- Alternative Energy System (Solar Powered) Utility Scale of our Zoning ordinance. He reiterates that we are only at the beginning stages of this review process. The Planning Board will continue its own review and at some point, there will be a public hearing. When the Planning Board is satisfied everything is in compliance with our zoning the project will be submitted to the county Planning Board for their review and they will make any recommendations/comments back to the Town planning board. There are 15 board members who vote on the county planning board. Board member Bosch answered a question from the audience about what the output is from these solar panels. Output is 20 percent of the 19 MW system on a daily basis. No representatives were in attendance from Saturn at this meeting. We will continue to carry this as a pre-conference application on the agenda. Subdivision Checklist - Chairman Griggs asks the board to review the proposed Subdivision checklist drafted by Board Member Bosch and make comments at our next meeting.

### HISTORIAN/HISORICAL SOCIETY REPORT

Historian Melissa Ierlan submitted the following written report; Just finished up painting six historical markers for the Town of Yates. I have a sign from Hulberton Rd. in Murray and the sign from the Universalist Church that I am painting now. The water leak that happened in the Historical Society building last fall has been repaired. We ended up replacing the floor in the meeting room as it was warped and still damp underneath. The back exit door had a rotted area that was replaced and we will be repainting the bathrooms and meeting room soon.

### SUPERVISOR REPORT

The town has sent a 90-day notice to the Village of Holley to terminate our water maintenance agreement with them; Superintendent Chalker is licensed to take over the water responsibilities. Matt Campbell and his crew were thanked for their service to Clarendon. Supervisor Moy reported data from the NYS Department of Taxation and Finance shows that Clarendon is the only Town in Orleans County that has a final equalization rate of 100%. Next Tuesday, the Association of Municipalities will hold its meeting at the Black North Inn; speakers will be about a County District Court, again.

### CORRESPONDENCE

Payment has been received from the Orleans County Treasurer for plowing and first roadside mowing in the amount of \$96,485.43. Payment has been received from the Orleans County Treasurer for collection of 2022 Solid Waste Fees in the amount of \$1050.50. The Orleans County Legislature has sent notice of Mortgage Tax Distribution for revenue received from October 1, 2021 through March 31, 2022; Clarendon will receive \$23,333.46. The Traffic Diversion Program revenues have been received from Orleans County for the first quarter in 2022 in the amount of \$358.66. The Orleans County Board of Elections has sent information on the upcoming elections to be held on June 28, 2022. Voting will be from 6:00 AM to 9:00 PM for registered voters of the Democratic and Republican parties. Snow and Ice revenue for 2021/2022 in the amount of \$16,601.61 has been received from the NYS Department of Transportation. Revenue in the amount of \$12,500.00 has been received from the sale of the 2007 Sterling plow at the 5/14/2022 auction in Palmyra.

But it all began with somebody's smile.

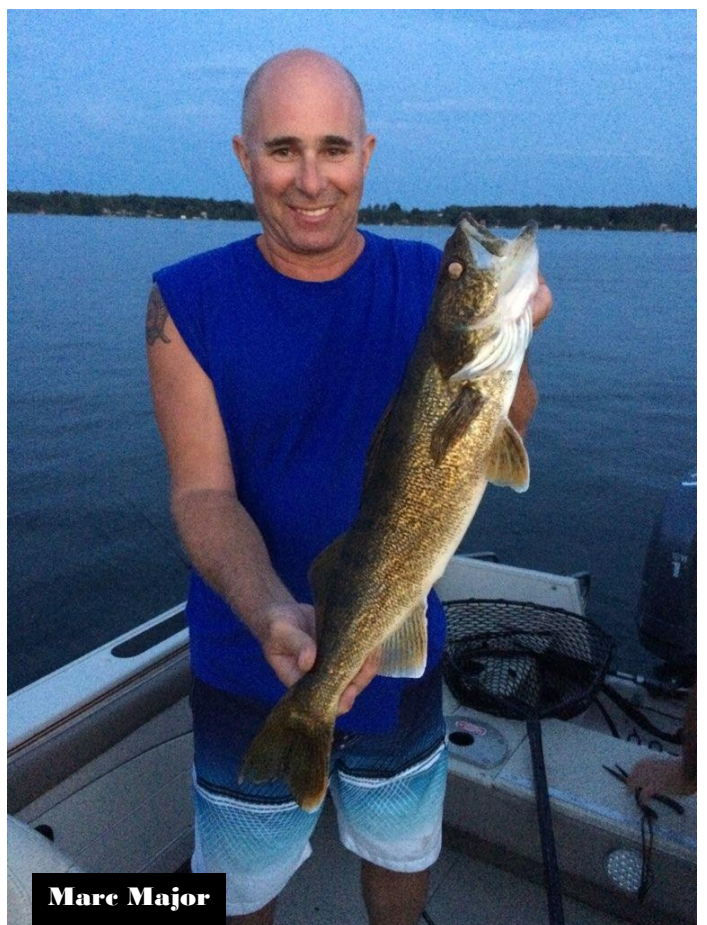

## Hillside Sketches

**John Ridler** was born in England in 1828. He came to the United States in 1864 and was a resident of Clarendon from 1879 until his death in 1904. His death certificate lists “senile dementia” as his cause of death which he suffered with for two years until he died.

The “Holley Standard” published an article that said he died on February 14, 1904 at age 75. The Reverend Henry Brown, pastor of the Christian Church at Manning and Reverend Sanford Brusie of the M.E. Church in Clarendon conducted the funeral services.



Before moving to Clarendon, John lived in Parma as shown on the 1875 census. His family included his wife Emma, son Arthur age 6, daughter Carrie age 4 and daughter Florence age 1. John Ridler’s occupation was farming. In 1901 he bought part of lot 135 on Hulberton Road from James Gunter. The map here shows Ridler’s farm on Hulberton Road and his tenant house across the street. John was shown on the 1892 census to be a farmer living in Clarendon with his wife Emma and daughters Florence age 18 and Carrie age 21. John’s son Arthur died in 1882 at age 13, cause of death unknown. John is buried in Hillside Cemetery with his wife and family.

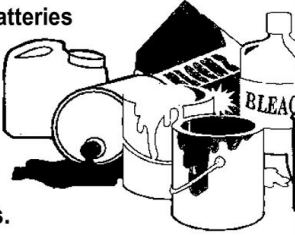
