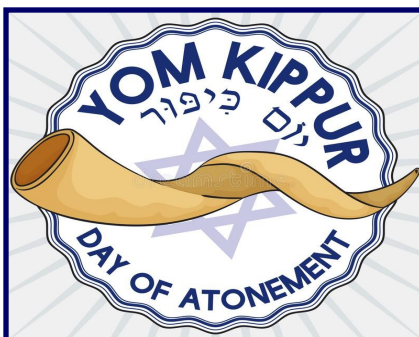

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD Meeting Highlights - September 2022



Clarendon Resident **Laura Kingdollar** addressed the Town Board and requested the wording in the town zoning law be amended to indicate a percentage of Clarendon's land that could be used for large-scale solar farms. When the zoning was being drafted, there were discussions by the board possibly limiting the acreage within the Agricultural/Residential District that could be utilized by large scale. Conversation suggested to perhaps limit 2% of the town's total acreage. No decision was made and no further discussions held. Mrs. Kingdollar's current concern is Mr. Wolf's intent to utilize his land for a large-scale solar farm of 1000 acres in size; Mrs. Kingdollar opined that it would take up more than 15% of the Ag/Res District and more than 4% of the entire town's acreage. Text from the comprehensive plan and zoning ordinance was referenced that objectives of such plans are to preserve the established character of public and private property and to encourage utilization of land for the purpose for which it is best suited. Supervisor will ask the Assessor's Office to confirm total acreage for Ag District parcels and how much land would be useable from under the powerlines out 1 ¼ miles each way. He will contact Laura.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Tracy Chalker was attending a conference and submitted the following written report: The crew has been working on roads through the work share program. We have chip-sealed Jackson Road, South Manning Road, Transit Road, Mansfield Road and Wood Road. Shoulder material is mixed and will be placed soon on Hulberton and Jackson Roads. All water meters have been changed out to radio reads. We did water-shut-offs on Sept. 12; hung 48 red tags on the 7th and ended up with two shut-offs. We continue working on mowing town properties. The camera system has been installed at the highway barns. The second roadside mowing is complete and we will be starting the third. The crew has also been doing maintenance on the trucks.

SUPERVISOR REPORT

Supervisor Richard Moy reported he's been working on the 2023 budget; that a letter and envelope now cost 76 cents to mail. Regarding the comprehensive plan survey, there are 1200 residences which would cost a lot to mail; considering on-line survey and/or requests for copies to be mailed to residents.

CORRESPONDENCE

Tim Hungerford, HV Audit, has taken a new job and resigned as Clarendon's Accounting Firm; Supervisor has hired Roberts Accounting CPAs from Spencerport to do the accounting. Supervisor read aloud a 'thank you' sent to Historian Melissa Ierlan for her help in researching the Gillis/Waite families. Orleans County has sent payment for the third roadside mowing in the amount of \$3,266.71. Ferrell Gas has sent a refund check in the amount of \$1426.21 from their fuel tanks when picked up. NYS Agriculture and Markets has sent satisfactory reports for the Dog Control Officer services and the Municipal Shelter Inspection completed. Orleans County Chamber of Commerce is calling for nominations for its annual awards dinner in October. Genesee Finger Lakes Planning Council has sent notice of its fall local government workshops.

OLD BUSINESS

Supervisor Moy reported that in speaking with the Association of Towns attorney, he was told that the town can not charge the water maintenance fee on the property tax bills or to anyone not hooked-up to the public waterline, including parcels in the ag districts. The Town Board rescinded that motion from last month's meeting. The Town Board adopted Resolutions regarding WD#14 SEQOR for lead agency declaration and determination of significance.

NEW BUSINESS

The Board amended the town fee schedule to include the water maintenance fee. The three-year Joint Youth Recreation Agreement renewal was adopted at \$4070.00 contribution annually. The Board asked Planning Board Chairman Griggs to prepare a draft of zoning ordinance revision for short term rentals to consider. The Town Board approved application from Ted & Holly Sheehan as an out-of-district water user at 4686 County Line Road, Town of Sweden in WIBA 11.

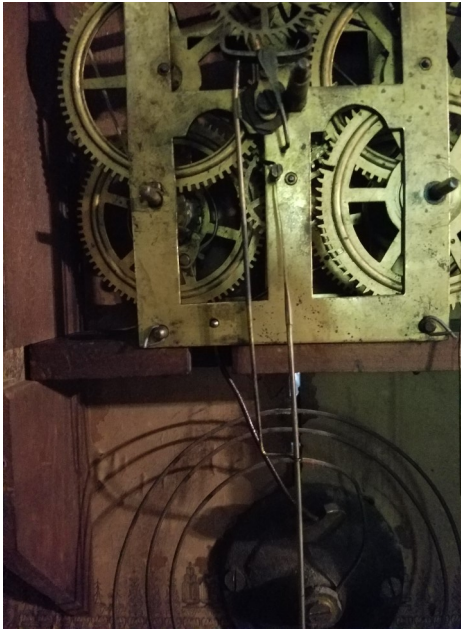
Who would not wish to leave behind a bit of tenderness

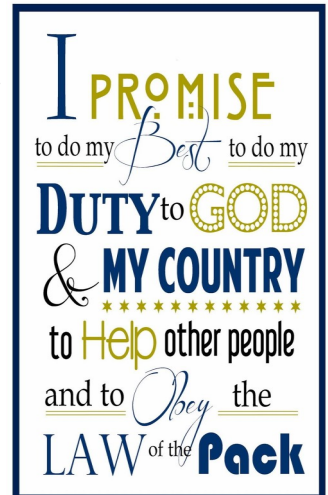

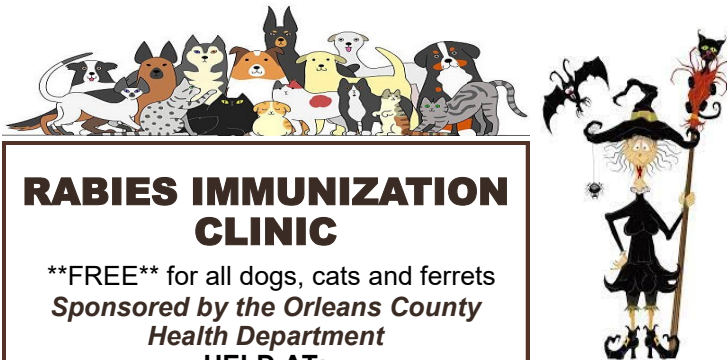
