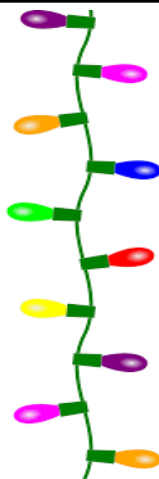

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD

Meeting Highlights - November 2022

The Clarendon Town Board held a public hearing to consider Local Law No. 2 of 2022 entitled A Local Law Increasing the Maximum income eligibility Level for the Senior Citizen Tax Exemption under Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law and Allowing the Disabled & Limited Income Exemption Under Section 459 of the Real Property Tax Law. No comments were heard.

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Tracy Chalker reported patching potholes on North Manning Road, Howard Road, Elizabeth Drive and County Line Road. The tree in the park has been trimmed and a couple bags of garbage left from the person living there have been picked up and removed. Trees along roads have been trimmed and garbage picked up on Wood Road. A lot of tires are again needing to be picked up. There was a water main break to fix on Hibbard Road on election day and a water tap and push were installed on County Line Road. Trucks are ready for snow; electronic waste was dropped off at the Town of Murray for recycling and the third roadside mowing is complete. The highway crew hung 162 red tags for non-payment of water. Downed trees in Hillside Cemetery were taken care of; the brush pile behind the highway garage was burned. A culvert on LaDue Road has been replaced and the crew has been picking up dead deer alongside the road. Superintendent Chalker requested a town board decision regarding purchase of a Super Cab Pick-up Truck; three quotes were presented: Orleans Ford \$48,000; West Herr Ford of Rochester \$50,035; Bob Johnson Ford \$49,450.00. It was reviewed that purchase of the truck would be from Water District No. 1. Councilmen in favor of keeping the purchase local and approved the quote from Orleans Ford Mercury, Inc., Medina.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Dave Griggs submitted the following written report: Exempt Subdivision Checklist - After review a motion was made, seconded and approved to adopt the Exempt Subdivision Checklist for future use by the Planning Board. Site Plan Review application - After review a motion was made, seconded and approved to adopt the Site Plan Review application for future use by the Planning Board. Chairman Griggs informs members that the Town Board requested the Planning Board to explore Zoning regulations for Short Term Rentals (STR) and submit recommendations for their review. Chairman Griggs will prepare an initial draft for future review by Planning Board. 2023 Planning Board reappointment recommendations and 2023 Planning Board meeting calendar were discussed. Item carried to next meeting. 11-09-2022 (Regular Meeting) Chairman Griggs presented the latest draft for Short Term Rentals for review. Changes were discussed and agreed on. Chairman Griggs will incorporate them into a revised preliminary Draft for continuing review at our next meeting. The Planning Board by unanimous consent approved submitting the following 2023 recommendations for reappointment to the Planning Board to the Town Board for their review and approval. David R. Griggs, Planning Board Chairman, one (1) year term to expire 12-31-2023. Kevin Johnson, Planning Board Deputy Chairman, one (1) year term to expire 12-31-2023. Michelle Lipke, Planning Board Alternate, one (1) year term to expire 12-31-2023. The Planning Board by unanimous consent adopted the 2023 meeting calendar as presented. The next regularly scheduled Planning Board meeting is 7:00 PM, November 22, 2022 at the Clarendon Town Hall, 16385 Church Street.

HISTORIAN REPORT

Historian Melissa Ierlan gave the following report: The Clarendon Historical Society has been winterized and the water shut off. We are doing a Christmas Parade December 9th from the fire hall to the

Clarendon Historical Society. I am currently restoring 3 historical markers. One from Clarendon, one from Millville and another from Albion. I have been attending the Murray Holley Historical Society and the Orleans County Historical Association meetings all summer. I purchased a large map of Orleans County from 1860 and it will be in the Stone Store. Dick Moy donated a box of dominoes from the early 1900's. It will be at the Stone Store with the checkerboard previously donated by Dick & Sandy Moy. Our friend Cherie is still decorating the Stone Store windows for every holiday. People enjoy seeing this.

CORRESPONDENCE

Association of Towns has sent notice of its Annual Meeting and Training School held in New York City, February 19-22, 2023. Orleans County Office of the District Attorney has sent the town's share of revenues from the 3rd quarter, 2022 traffic diversion program in the amount of \$2820.00. Planning Chairman David Griggs completed the Land Use Training for Local Officials toward his Planning Board training. The town has received \$36.54 from the Orleans Economic Development Agency for the town's share of 2022 PILOT payment from Falls Railroad. Updates of the Town of Barre Heritage Wind Project has been received and the NYSDOT has sent information regarding increased funding at a level of \$200M per year for the BRIDGE NY Program.

OLD BUSINESS

The Town Board approved the final budget for the year 2023. Tax rate per thousand dollars of assessed value will be \$ 4.34; fire protection rate is 89 cents per 1000. The budget is available at the Town Clerk's Office or at townofclarendon.org. The Board adopted proposed Local Law No. 1 of 2022 entitled A Local Law Providing for Written Notification of Defects and Obstructions on Town Highways, Bridges, Streets, Sidewalks, Crosswalks and Culverts in the Town of Clarendon and proposed Local Law No. 2 of 2022 entitled A Local Law Increasing the Maximum income eligibility Level for the Senior Citizen Tax Exemption under Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law and Allowing the Disabled & Limited Income Exemption Under Section 459 of the Real Property Tax Law. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Department of State and shall apply to assessment rolls prepared on the basis of taxable status dates occurring on and after March 1, 2023.

NEW BUSINESS

Supervisor Moy explained that the proposed Monroe County Ambulance price for a one-year contract is based on the number of 911 calls made from our town. Clarendon's cost is \$18,800. Monroe will purchase two ambulances, stationing at the Albion Fire Company and one at the Holley Fire Company. A resident questioned Mercy Flight; it was stated that they are taking over the COVA ambulance. Representatives from the seven towns to be affected were present at the meeting to review the proposal. The Clarendon Town Board did authorize Supervisor Richard Moy to sign into agreement with Monroe Ambulance for the year 2023 as presented at a cost of \$18,800 on behalf of the Town of Clarendon. The Town Board adopted a Resolution authorizing placement of Lateral Restrictions within proposed Clarendon Water District No. 14. The Organizational Meeting for the year 2023 was scheduled for January 3, 2023 at 6:00 PM at the Town Hall and Fred Seeman III was reappointed to a 5-year seat on the Clarendon Zoning Board of Appeals. Code Enforcement Officer Melissa Ierlan referenced the report/packet submitted to the board members regarding the structure at 4694 Hall Road. The mobile was tagged for inspection when the water was turned off for non-payment.

A Hearing will be held on Tuesday, December 20, 2022 at 6:30 PM at the Town Hall, 16385 Church Street in Clarendon, NY for the purpose of affording the owner the opportunity to be heard in opposition of this Order. Discussion was held regarding no restroom facilities in the town park. The Board authorized the pavilion at the town park on Holley Byron Road be closed to the public from November 1 through April 1.

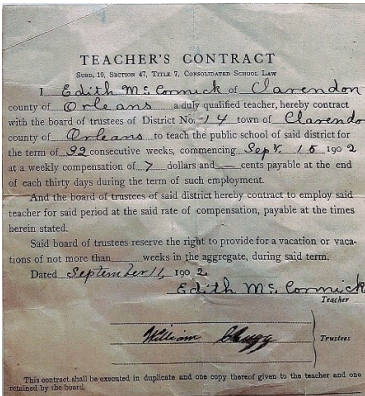
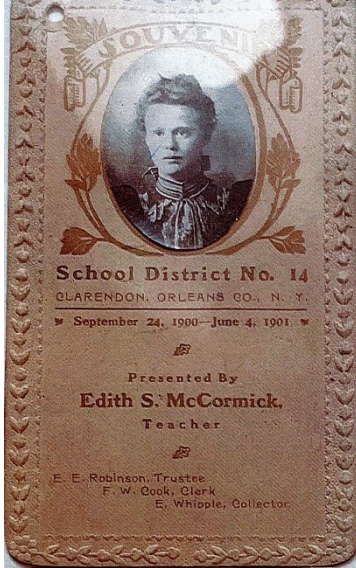

Edith McCormick was born in Clarendon on Glidden Road on November 25, 1879. She grew up in Clarendon and attended the Holley Union School. Upon graduation, she attended the Brockport Normal School and then proceeded to teach school for several years in Clarendon.



In September of 1902 Edith signed a contract to teach school for 32 weeks making \$7 a week.

This was a raise from the year before as she only made \$6.50.

In 1904 she married John McCormick of Elizabeth, New Jersey. The couple lived in New Jersey for several years. It is not known if she left teaching after getting married. John and Edith had no children.



After moving back from New Jersey, they bought a house at 41 Rochester Street, Bergen, NY. John was employed at this time as a shipping and stock clerk for a sewing machine company.

Edith died on January 19, 1944 after an illness which lasted several months at her home in Bergen, NY.
