CLARENDON TOWN BOARD

Meeting Highlights - February, 2024

Supervisor Moy added two items to the meeting agenda. Sandy Shaw during Open End and add #7 to New Business - Town Hall Garden.

OPEN END

Sandra Shaw, Director of the Community Free Library in the Village of Holley addressed the board with upcoming activities planned at the library. The annual Wine Tasting fundraiser will be held on April 26th from 7PM to 9PM; tickets go on sale April 1st for \$20 each. Tickets will be available at the library and the Town Clerk's Office. At her request, the board gave the director permission to borrow the wood carvings of Clarendon sites carved and donated by Bob Barrett to place in the library for the wine tasting. Ms. Shaw is in the process of planning a Solar Eclipse program for Monday, April 8, 2024. School is closed for that day and permission is being sought to hold the event at the high school athletic fields from 2PM to 4PM; parking in the school lot. The library has 2000 pair of glasses to pass out and everyone needs to bring their own chairs. The Village of Holley is looking into having food trucks there. Ms. Shaw is also looking into the possibility of buses to shuttle senior citizens to the event.

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT

Superintendent Tracy Chalker reported that the crew has been plowing and sanding as needed; that a lot of salt was used in January. At the break in weather, pot holes were patched and more ash trees cleaned up. The heavy rain and snow melt washed out a section of Lake Road ; a culvert needed to be replaced which took a couple of days. Multiple deer have been removed from the roadsides. Residents on Munger Road have complained about the construction trucks on the road but there are no restrictions there. Superintendent Chalker will attend Advocacy Day in Albany March 5 and 6 to request an increase in CHIPS funding. Superintendents have a meeting scheduled with State Senator Rob Ortt on April 1 to discuss possible funding. Red tags were hung for unpaid water bills; there were several irate residents this time. General discussion was held regarding the manhours and cost to handle the procedure two days after the due date. Superintendent tries to contact everyone on the shut-off list by going door to door prior to terminating service; to save the resident the \$80 in fees to turn water off and then back on. Superintendent Chalker has spoken with Bill Adler of HCH regarding possible grant applications. He feels it's possible to get a capital improvement grant for a generator, fuel system and garage doors at the highway garage. Superintendent also asked about a grant for a roadside mowing tractor. Specs and price sheets for a new plow truck were submitted to the town board; cost is approximately \$300,000. Superintendent Chalker wants to maintain the three-year replacement plan put in place by Superintendent Swanger before him. Delivery takes 1 ½ years from date of order to receive the vehicle. Superintendent will address this at the March meeting after the board has had time to review the spec sheets.

SUPERVISOR REPORT

Supervisor Dick Moy reported receiving 4th quarter revenue of the Traffic Diversion Program from the County for \$1080.00. Supervisor informed that he has a very large report about county court if anyone wants to read it.

CORRESPONDENCE

The Town has received an abstract of revenues paid by the County in 2023; items included mortgage tax, county snow removal, mowing, solid waste administration fee, traffic diversion program, DWI cases and sales tax. The Village of Albion, Town of Albion and Town of Gaines have entered into an agreement to establish the Albion Joint Fire District. The Town received Notice that the T/Albion intends to act as lead agency for the SEQRA review. The County has sent 2024 sales tax apportionments to towns and villages; Clarendon will receive \$112,299.89.

OLD BUSINESS

Supervisor Moy revisited the increase in water rates and daily meter charge from Monroe County Water Authority effective January 1, 2024. Clarendon increased its rate by ten cents per thousand gallons up to \$4.35 in January. The daily meter charge wasn't taken into consideration. Area towns rates were compared: T/Barre charges \$5.70/1000 gallons; V/Holley \$5.75/1000 gallons; T/Kendall \$6.00/1000 and T/Sweden \$5.70/1000 (which is supplied by MCWA). Discussion was held and the town board authorized the Clarendon water rates be increased by an additional twenty-five cents making the per thousand gallons rate \$4.60. This will increase each quarterly average billing of \$70.00 by \$6.00. Supervisor Moy informed he intends to put the water maintenance fees collected into the NYCLASS investment program. He's working on getting the exact balance to transfer.

NEW BUSINESS

Supervisor Richard Moy was reappointed as Marriage Officer for the Town of Clarendon; term to expire 12/31/2025. Resolutions were adopted to: authorize town property access to USDA to survey/trap European Cherry Fruit Fly and Box Tree Moth; accept affirmation of highway equipment audit; accept affirmation of court records audit and approve Supplemental Agreement No. 3 to the NYSDOT Contract for Snow & Ice. The Town Board accepted Beth Skehan's proposal to care for the town hall garden at a rate of \$735.00 for the 2024 season.



Hillside Sketches




Simeon Glidden


was born in Clarendon to Simeon Glidden and Sarah Carpenter Glidden on November 16, 1843. He spent his entire life in the area. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge of Holley. On May 20, 1868 he married Cynthia A. Foster of Clarendon. They had 3 children Blanche, Harry and Simeon Ralph. Simeon lost his wife after 50 years of marriage on July 5, 1918. In 1891 Simeon Glidden was the proprietor of the Clarendon



Hotel (the post office is located there today) He purchased the hotel from the former owner a M.V. Foster who was his father-in-law. Below is a newspaper account of his violation of the Raines Liquor Law at the time.



From very early history, we know that Clarendon always had baseball teams. The picture from the 1880's shows the Clarendon baseball team with their manager Simeon Glidden.



Simeon was elected president of the Clarendon Driving Park Association in 1900 and his officers were John Bowen, Eli May,

Dr. M Brackett, Ray Cole, Guy Bowen, Joseph Potter and Charles Hinds. There were a series of horse races held during the season in Clarendon. (Where this race track was is a mystery.)

Simeon suffered from a heart condition and died at his son's home in Batavia, NY on October 3, 1921 and was buried in Hillside Cemetery.



Clarendon BSA Troop 59 Environmental Conservation Service Project



The Clarendon BSA Troop 59 recently completed an environmental service project with local DEC Officer Nathan Godson. With funding from Orleans County Sportsman Federation, the troop was able to design, construct and install 13 Wood Duck houses in several locations in Eastern Orleans County. During the project 10 scouts were able to learn about Wood Ducks and their habitat in addition to other conservation issues the DEC officer deals with on a regular basis. They were able to learn woodworking safety and project planning and coordination. Each scout built at least one Wood Duck house and helped install it at the designated location. This was a great experience for all involved from the scouts to the leaders and DEC officer Godson. Additional Wood Duck houses will be installed in the spring. Clarendon BSA Troop 59 looks forward to other environmental and community service projects in the future.


